### **Safer and Healthier Schools**

The bond proposal will provide critical repairs throughout the district such as replacing deteriorating roofs, improving ventilation, and making seismic structural reinforcements so that our schools are safe during an earthquake.

### **Stronger Security**

Students and teachers deserve to feel safe while at school which is why the bond will update safety and security systems, including security cameras, fencing and entry access controls.

### **Better Tools for Learning**

Technology is a critical tool in education. This bond will ensure special education and kindergarten classrooms are better able to meet students' needs and will enable the district to update aging computers and devices.

### **Reduce overcrowding**

As parts of our community continue to grow, targeted schools in our district will need to add more classroom space. The Beaverton School Bond will allow the district to prepare for future growth.

The bond will raise \$723 million by increasing the current tax rate of \$2.09 per \$1,000 of assessed value by an estimated 25 cents. For a home with an average assessed value, that's about \$76 per year of additional investment.
