Goals and Objectives

A draft goal statement was reviewed and edited by the subcommittee.

Coordinate systems of care and public safety using a trauma-informed approach and data-driven decision-making to:

- *address root causes of violence in our community,*
- *intervene at the first sign of risk and respond effectively when violence does occur,*
- *repair, strengthen and restore our youth, families, and communities that have been affected by violence, and*
- *reduce recidivism rates for target population.*

Focus Community Maps

As outlined in the OJJDP model, focus communities must be established. See the attached meeting presentation for more information.
