Introductions, Announcements, and Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Shiprack opened the meeting and introductions were made.

The June LPSCC minutes were approved.

The following new LPSCC Members were welcomed: Undersheriff Mike Reese (MCSO), Chief Mike Marshman (PPB), Captain Claudio Grandjean (GPD) and Deena Corso (DCJ Juvenile).

Judge Waller noted the Multnomah County Court has adopted the pledge of fairness. Due to current events in public safety, the announcement will come soon on the steps of the Justice Center.

Mike Reese noted MCSO is vacating the Hansen Building, which will become a homeless shelter.

Jason Gates extended an invitation to the Night Out Event this Friday at 5pm at Woodvillage Baptist Church.

Suzanne Hayden noted the US Attorney's Office and other groups are holding a community engagement event for immigrants on September 22nd.

Ross Caldwell from CJC introduced Madeleine Dardeau as the new grant analyst.

Commissioner Shiprack noted the White House Data Driven Justice Initiative. The Census is interested in Oregon.

Abbey Stamp noted the change in meeting structure.

Risk, Need, and Responsivity: Evolving Evidence Based Practices

Scott Taylor provided a review of risk defined by DCJ, risk tools, types of risk, and risk tolerance. See the [presentation](#) for more details.

Abbey Stamp presented an overview of Doug Marlowe's Risk and Need Matrix and the Need Principle. There was discussion of abuse and addiction. This is complex for the system, but knowing how many people are in each box helps determine how to allocate resources. Proximal and Distal Goals were defined. Judge McKnight noted examples need to be used when presenting the concept.

Mike Reese noted this is more art than science.

Judge Waller asked about determining the length of time for the distal goals.

 - Identification of stakeholders who should have this information
 - Identify areas of practice that would benefit from Marlowe's quadrant science
 - Discuss possible strengths and weaknesses of risk assessment and movement
 - toward Marlowe's concepts
