## Introductions, Announcements, and Approval of Minutes

Abbey Stamp called the meeting to order and introductions were made.

The September 29<sup>th</sup> Minutes were approved with the correction of the date of the Veterans Stand Down from November 11<sup>th</sup> to September 11<sup>th</sup>,

### **Emergency Management**

Chris Voss of Emergency Management gave a presentation on coordinated response. The Multnomah County plan looks like the State plan which is similar to the Federal plan so that layers can work together. The presentation included predicted needs after the Cascadia Earthquake, the county's roles and responsibilities in a disaster, emergency management programs, planning and logistics, damage assessment, county point of distribution and resources needed, shelter needs, top tier projects, the plan structure and sequence, emergency support functions, state of emergency powers, and next steps. ### **Cyber Security Briefing**

Dennis Tomlin of IT Security gave a presentation and noted October is Cyber Security month. The presentation included a real-time visual showing the reality of international cyber attacks, how high the stakes are, who the threats are and what they want, how an incursion occurs and how the county responds, the county's strategy, the gaps and efforts for FY 2016, and how the human user is critical in preventing cyber attacks.
