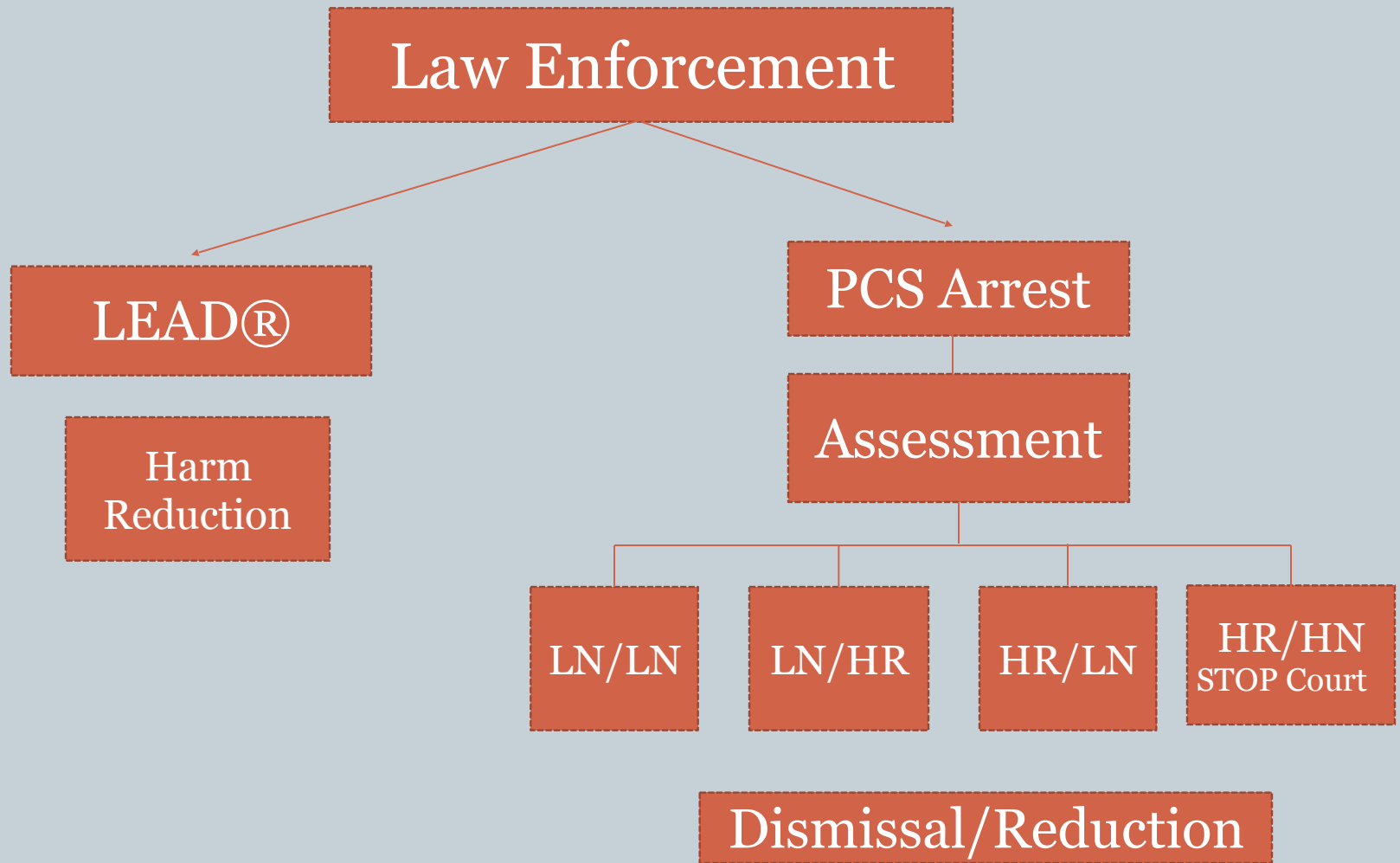

# TREATMENT FIRST PROGRAM



- Applies to all PCS issued cases
- Tier 1 - Reduced at issuing to a misdemeanor (97%)
- Tier 2 – Issued as a felony (CDO/SQ)
- Opportunity to be assessed before court date
- Tailored supervision and treatment based on detailed assessment of risk and needs
- Individualized treatment response
- Opportunity for dismissal or reduction
- HR/HN- STOP Court participants

# Treatment First Numbers

High Needs	HR/HN 512 (1,024) 50%	LR/HN 93 (1,024) 9%
Low Needs	HR/LN 232 (1,024) 23%	LR/LN 187 (1,024) 18%

# What is LEAD®?



- LEAD® is a pre-booking harm reduction program.
- LEAD® allows officers to redirect low level offenders engaged in drug activity to services and resources specific to the needs of the individual instead of jail and prosecution.
- LEAD® participants begin working immediately with case managers to access services.
- There are currently 95 individuals in the LEAD® program.

# LEAD®'s goals include:



- Reduce the harm a drug offender causes him or herself and to the surrounding community
- Provide services to individuals experiencing addiction or abuse of a controlled substance
- Reduce recidivism rates for low-level offenders
- Decrease the number of persons of color being arrested and referred for prosecution for these offenses.

# Geographic Area of LEAD®



- Individuals are eligible for LEAD® if contacted for PCS/or social referrals in:
- Downtown
- Old Town
- Lloyd District
- LEAD® is looking to expand the geographic area to across the river in the vicinity of SE 12<sup>th</sup> Ave and south while also looking to increase the number of Officers that can refer individuals to LEAD®.
