Project Scope

The project will convert a section of NE Sandy Blvd to a modern urban street with turn lanes. It will include:



Pavement and drainage improvements



New sidewalks and bike lanes



Enhancements to existing bus stops



New right turn lane for traffic entering the Townsend Farms business park

Project Schedule



Design completed and contractor Kodiak Paving was selected and awarded the contract.



Utility relocation has been completed.



March 2018: Construction began.



October 2018: Project to be completed.

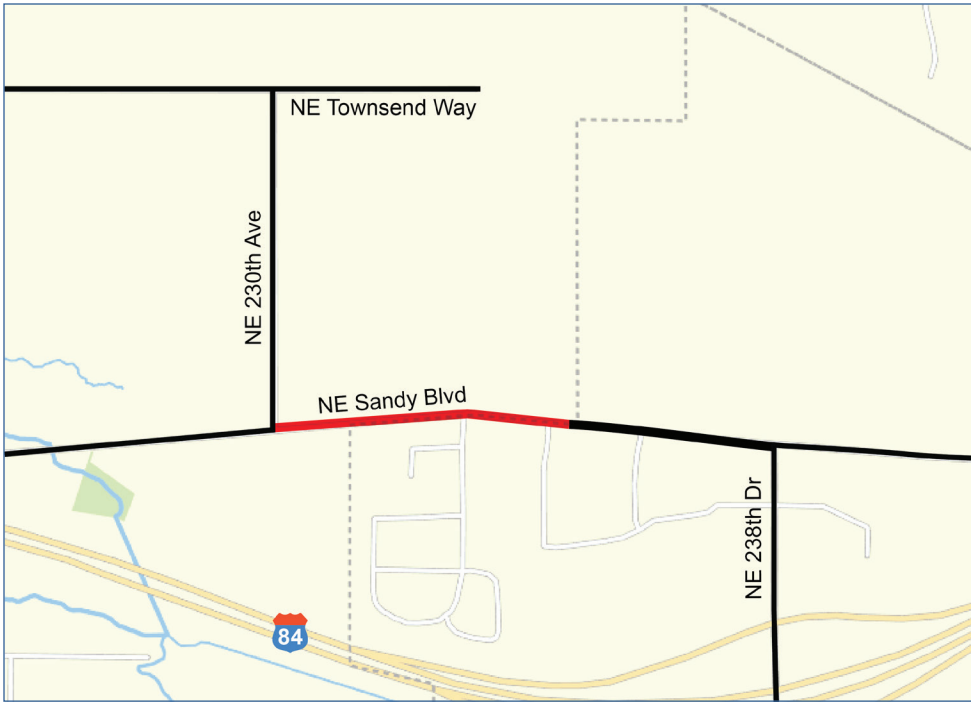
Construction Impacts

- No road closure will be required.
- During work hours, flaggers will direct two way traffic on a single lane, which will delay traffic.
- Contractor will rebuild road in two phases, one at a time. The north side is completed, the south side is under construction.
- Access for pedestrians, residents and businesses will be maintained.
- During work at driveways, brief access interruptions, with prior notice.
- TriMet bus stops for the 21 Sandy Blvd/223rd bus lines within the project area are temporarily closed during construction.

Public Outreach & Planning

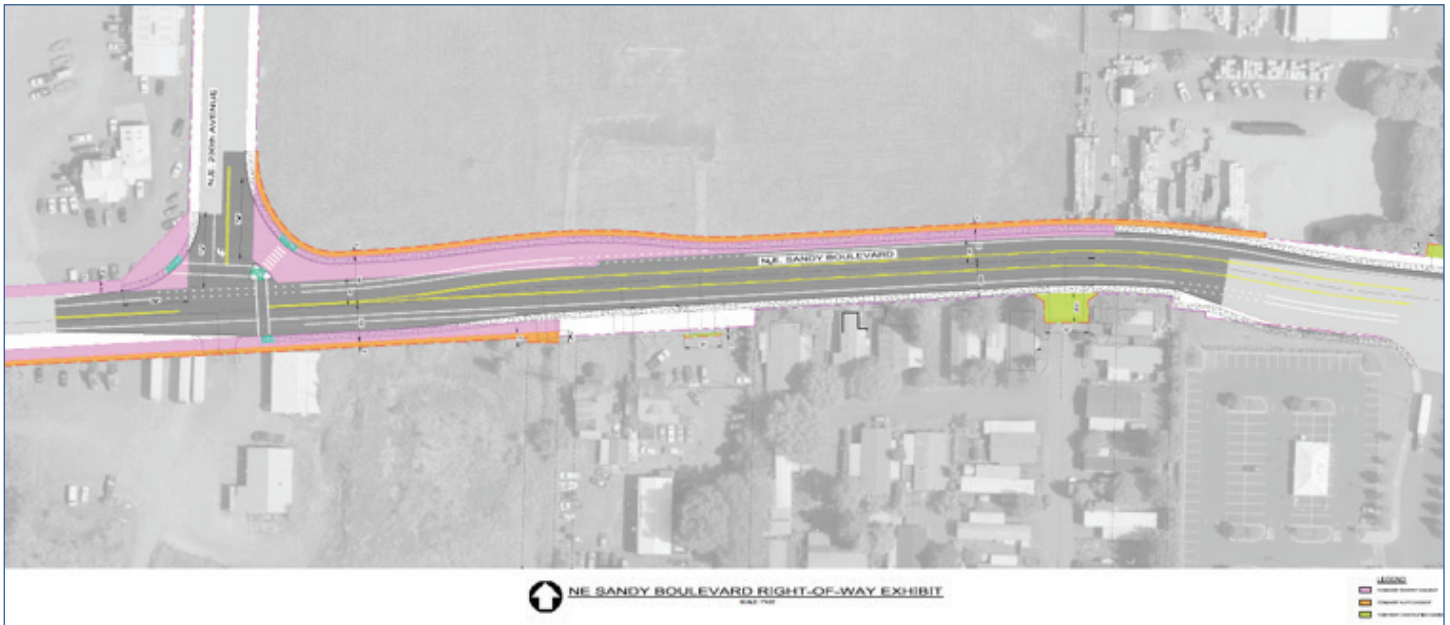


The project is part of a multi-agency effort to convert the east section of NE Sandy Blvd into a modern arterial road. A public open house was held in **June 2015** during the design phase. A pre-construction public meeting was held on **February 26, 2018** at Wood Village Baptist Church. The Wood Village City Council and staff at the City of Fairview have been briefed on the project. A second public meeting at Wood Village Baptist Church held on **September 24, 2018**.

Budget Funding
