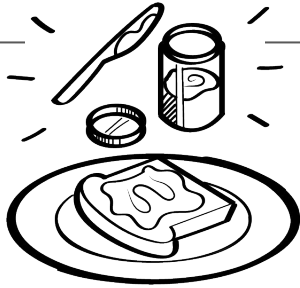

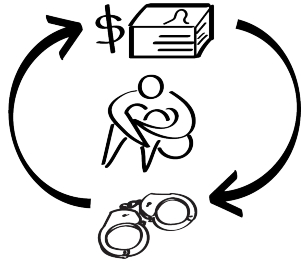

# Transforming Justice Project Update



## Criminalizing Poverty

A 2022 study in Oklahoma County found that “fines and fees contributed to a criminalization of low-income defendants, placing them at risk of ongoing court involvement through new warrants and debt collection.” While Multnomah County partners have worked diligently to decrease fines and fees, it is important to reiterate the need to continually mitigate the negative financial consequences that do not lead to wellness, recovery, and better public safety.
