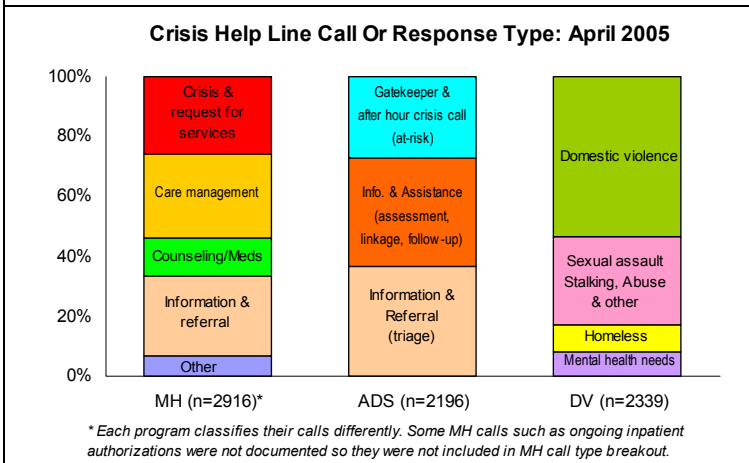
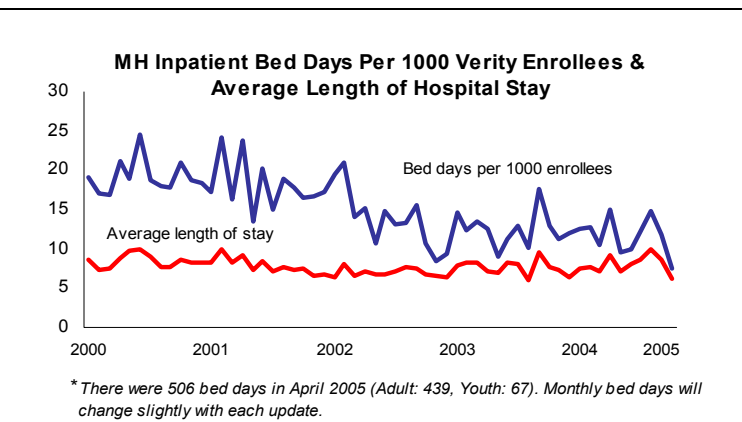
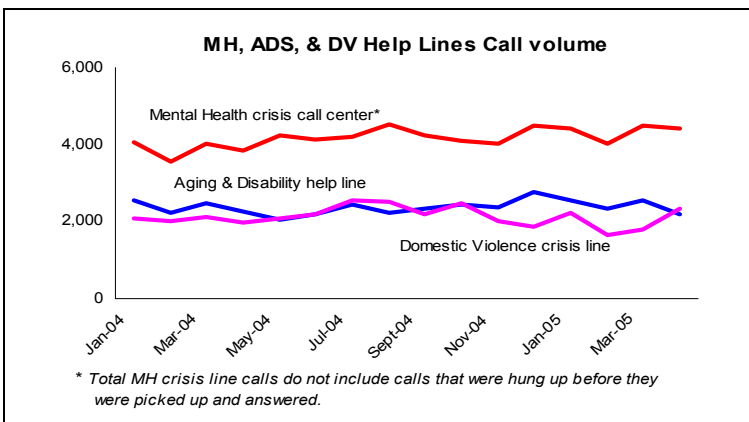
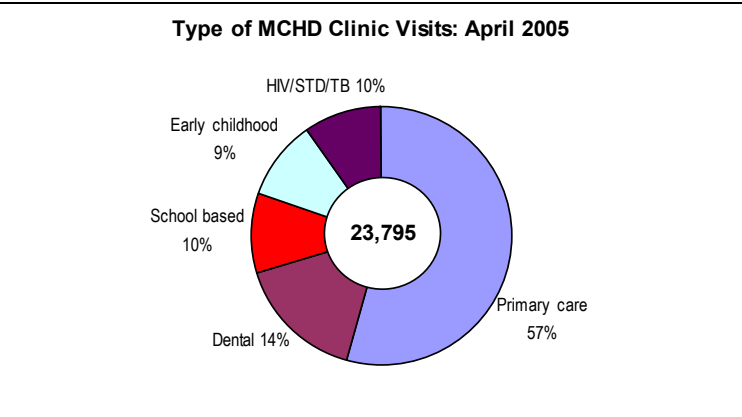
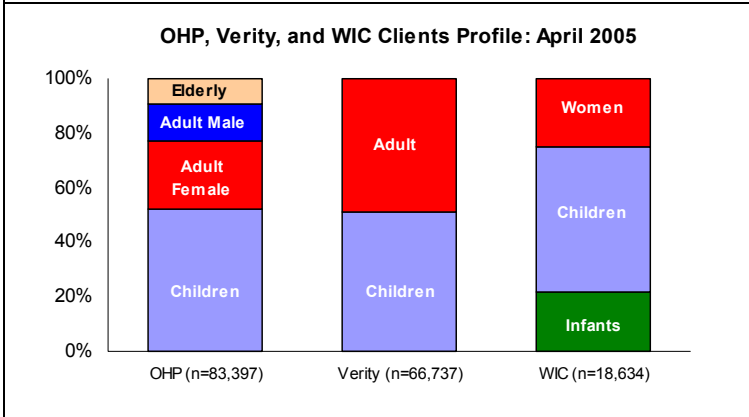
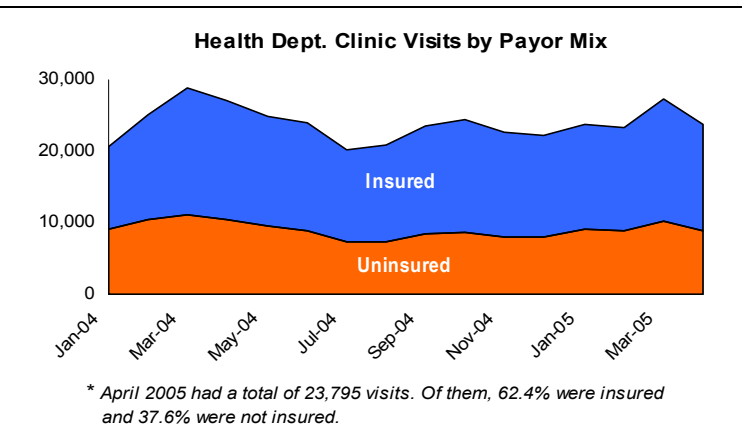
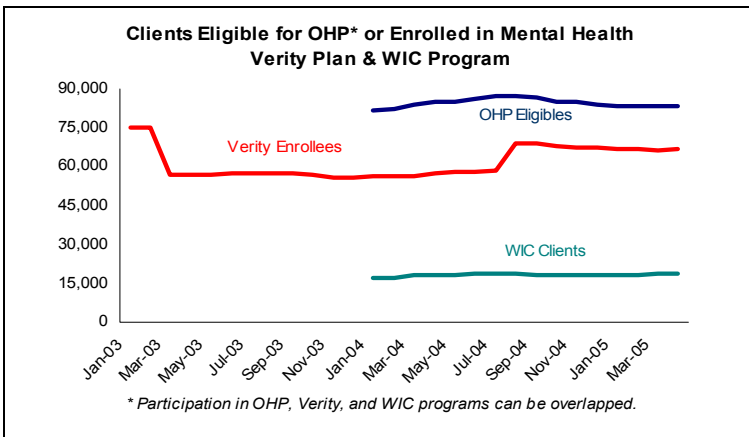
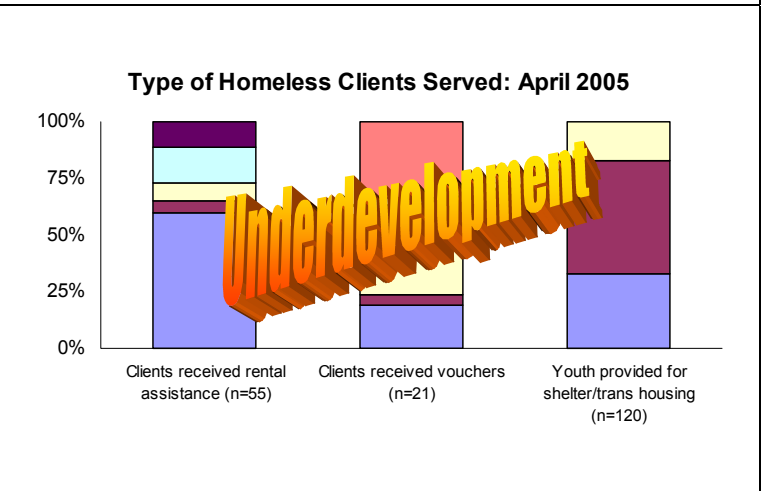
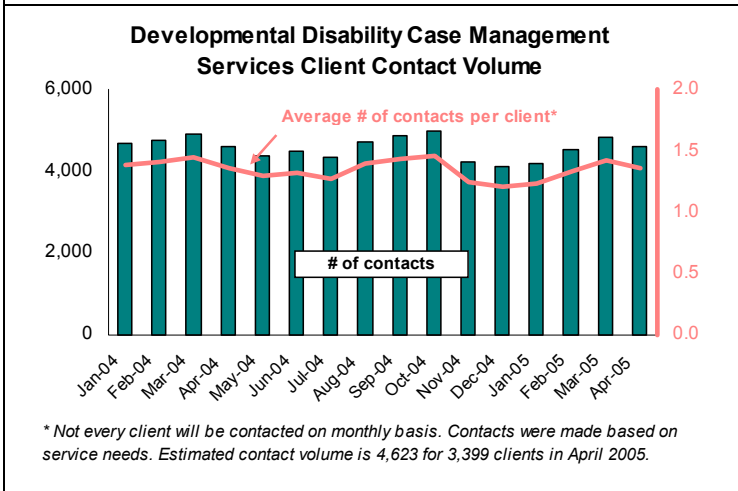
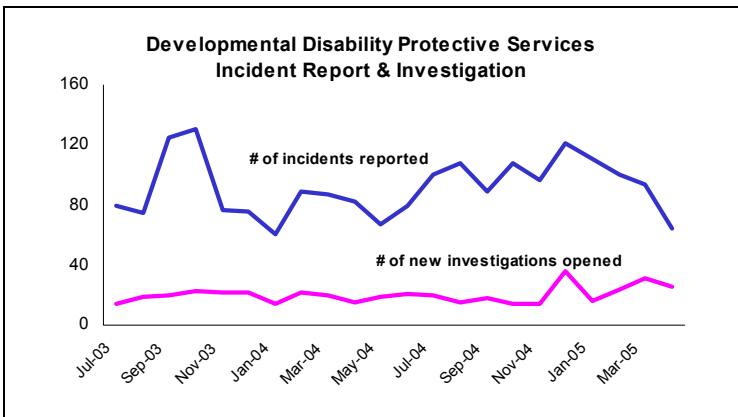
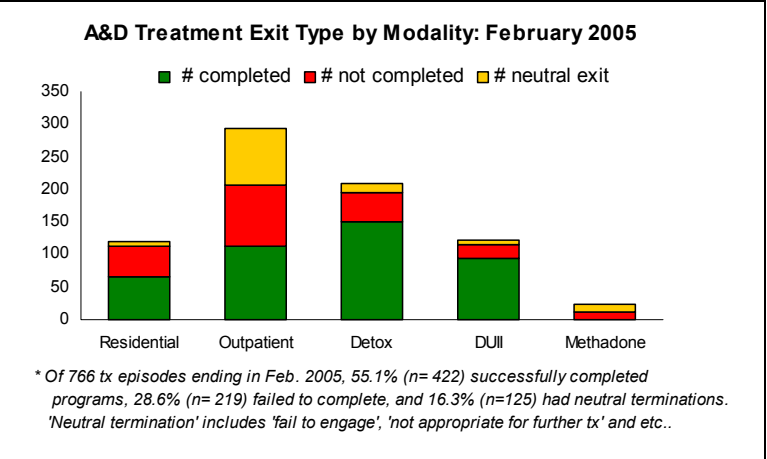
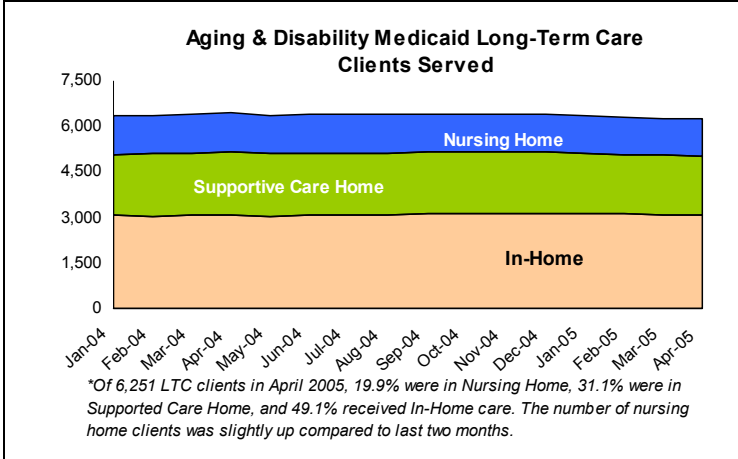
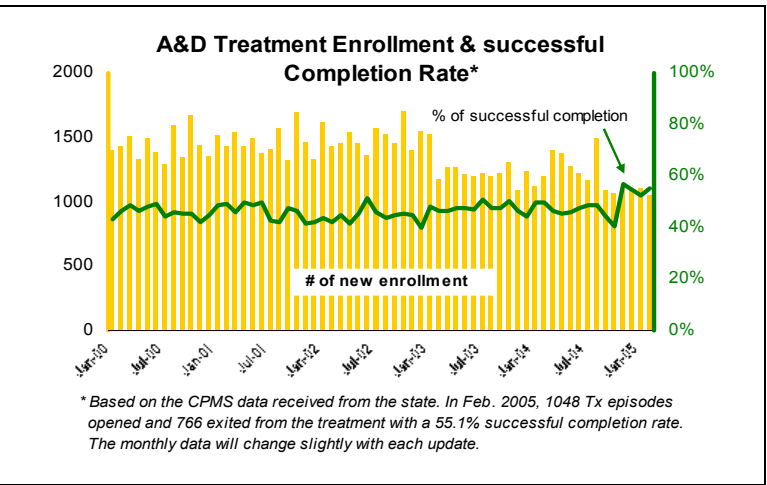
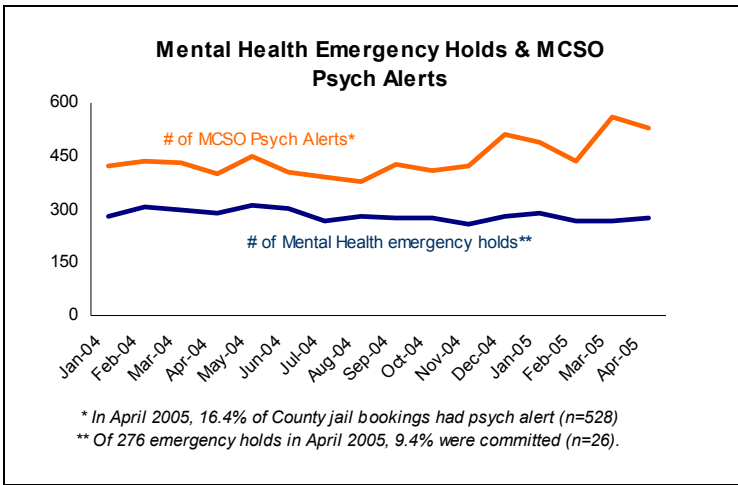


# BASIC NEEDS PRIORITY BRIEF: APRIL 2005



**Notes:** Total verity inpatient days continue to decline, as well as the bed days per 1,000 verity enrollees and the average length of stay. The average daily call volume for ADS help line was down from last month while the call volume for domestic violence help line was significantly up. Health Department's clinic visits dropped in April after last month's peak.



**Notes:** The number of families/individuals receiving vouchers or rental assistance dropped in April, possibly due to warmer weather and time lag in data entry. There hasn't been much change in numbers of new A&D treatment enrollment since last September. The treatment completion rate has been staying above 50% for four months.
