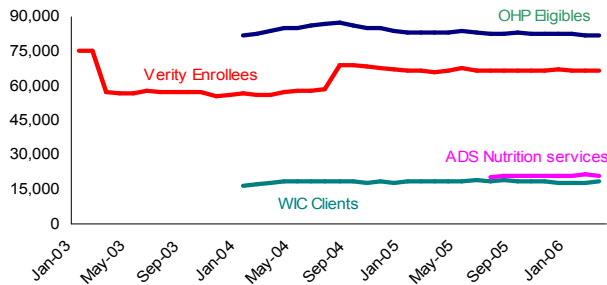

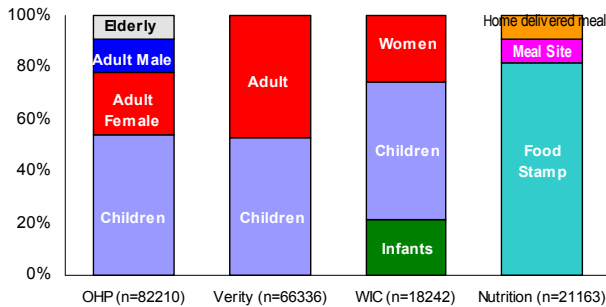
## Multnomah County Basic Needs Clients

Clients Enrolled or Served by Basic Needs Programs



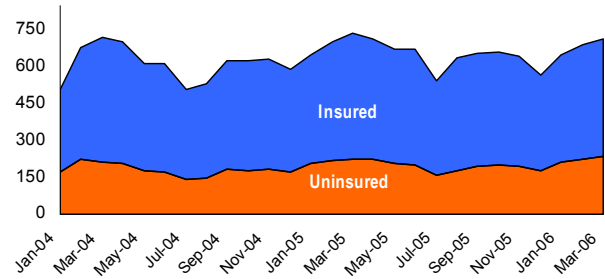
\* Participation in OHP, Verity, WIC, and ADS nutrition service programs can be overlapped.

Clients in Basic Needs Programs: March 2006



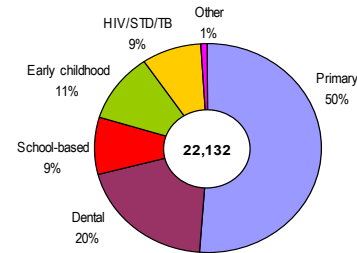
## Multnomah County Health Clinic Visits

\* March 2006 had a total of 714 average daily visits. Of those, 67% were insured and 33% were not insured.

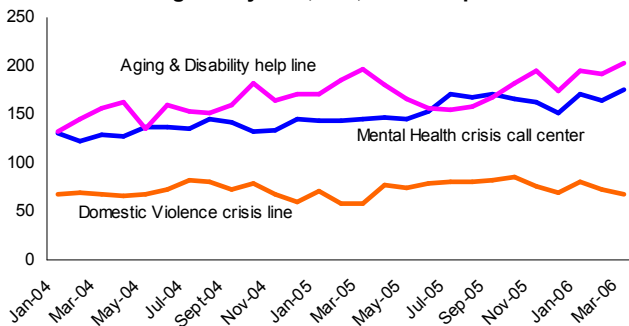
Type of MCHD Clinic Visits: March 2006



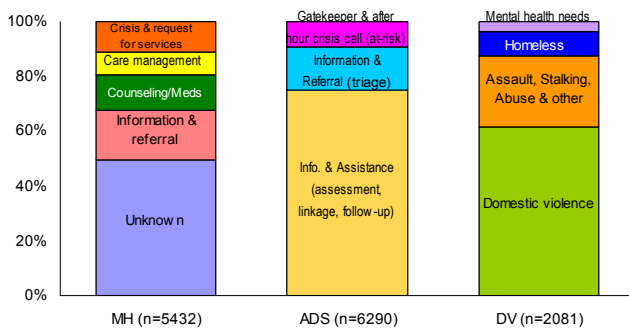
\* The above data does not include pharmacy, immunization, and WIC visits. In addition, there were 3,517 clinic visits and lab tests conducted at County's adult correction facilities in Mar. 2006, with an average daily of 113. Juvenile correction health data were unavailable for the month.

Average Daily ADS, MH, & DV Help Line Calls

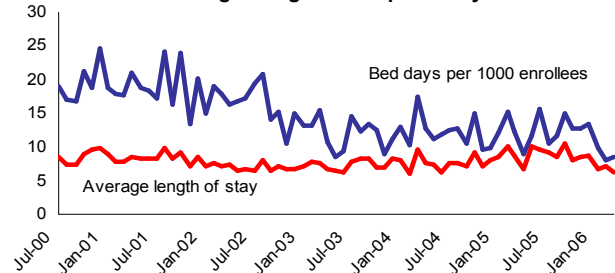


Crisis Help Line Call Or Response Type: March 2006



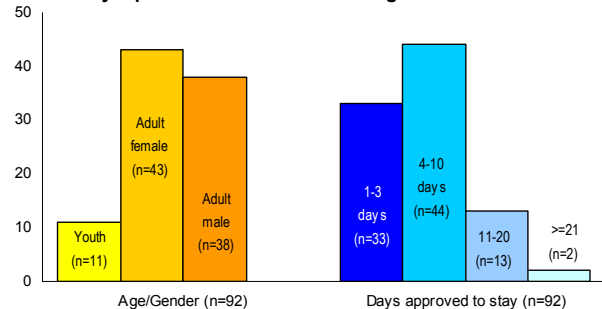
## Mental Health Verity Inpatient Days

\* There were 567 bed days in March 2006 (Adult: 504, Youth: 63).

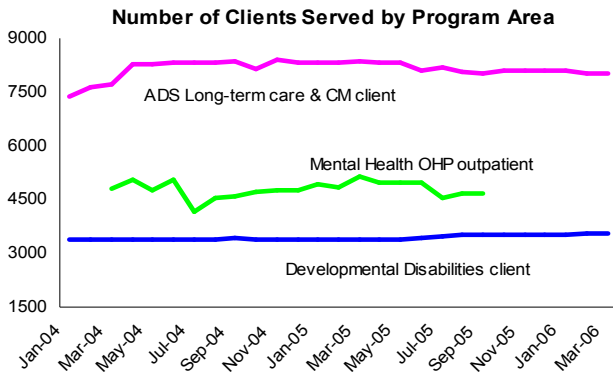
Verity Inpatient Admission/Discharge Profile: Mar. 2006



\* The 567 paid bed days in March 2006 represent a total of 92 hospital discharges.

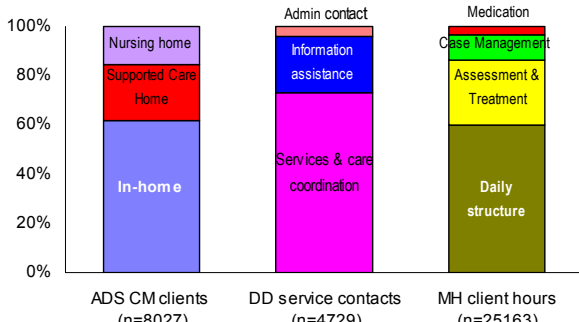
**Notes:** The average daily Health Clinic Visits increased 3% over February. The average daily Mental Health Crisis and ADS help line calls showed a steady upward trend. The March MH (n=175) and ADS (n=203) daily call volumes were the highest since the data collection started in Jan. 2004. The average daily inpatient bed days per 1000 Verity members showed a slight increase to 8.5 from February's average of 8.0. However, bed days per discharge reduced to 6.2 from 7.2 in February.

## Clients and Case Management Services



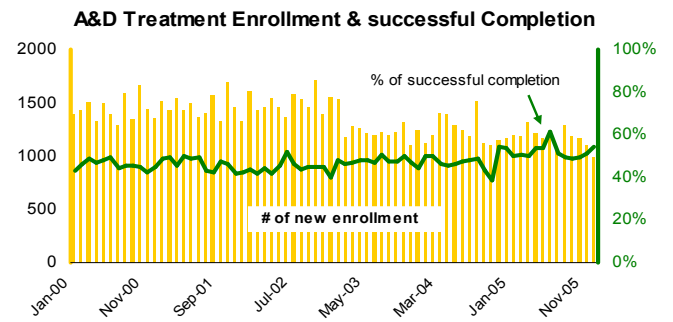
\* Data for mental health outpatient services is temporarily unavailable due to database conversion issue.

### Client or Service Type: March 2006



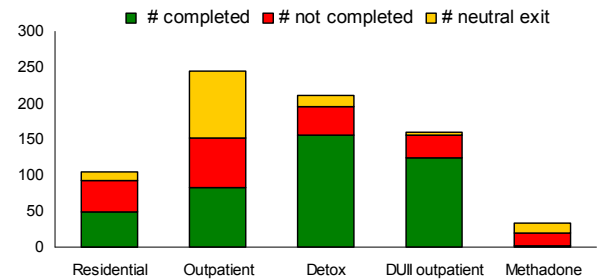
\* The latest available mental health outpatient data (Sep. 2005) were used. In Sep. 2005, 4671 outpatients had a total of 25,163 hours--5.4 hours on average.

## Multnomah County Addictions Treatment



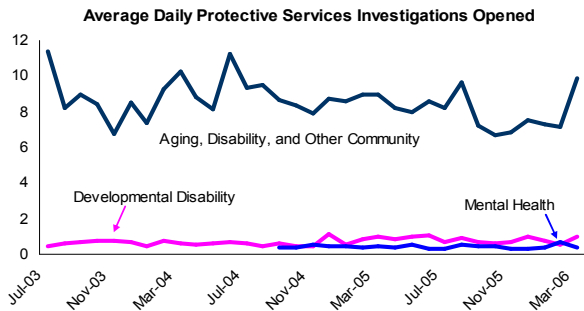
\* Based on the CPMS data received from the state. In Dec. 2005, 990 Tx episodes opened and 756 exited from the treatment with a 54.5% successful completion rate. The monthly data will change slightly with each update.

### A&D Treatment Exit Type by Modality: Dec. 2005



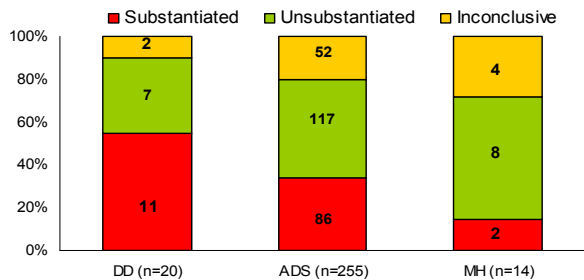
\* Of 756 tx episodes ending in December 2005, 54.5% (n= 412) successfully completed programs, 26.6% (n= 201) failed to complete, and 18.9% (n=143) had neutral terminations. 'Neutral termination' includes 'fail to engage', 'not appropriate for further tx' and etc..

## Protective Services for Vulnerable Populations



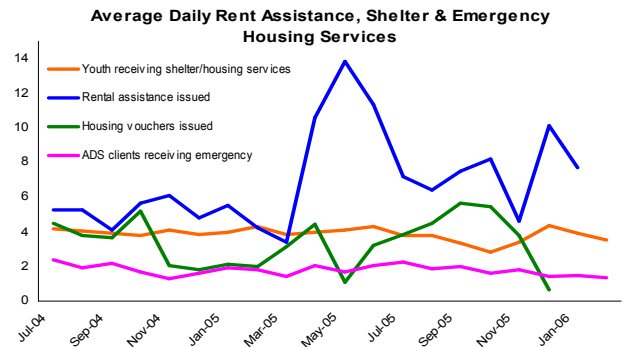
\*Each program serves different populations. ADS is responsible for all protective investigations not covered by developmental disability and mental health services so they have the largest client base.

### Investigation Case/allegation Closed: March 2006



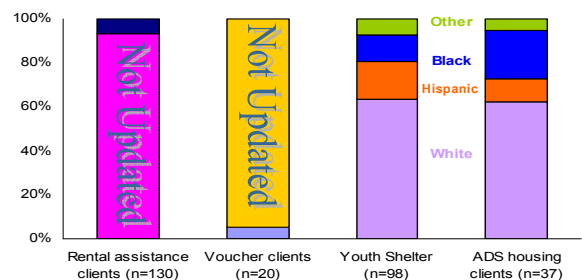
\* Overall, 232 protective service investigation cases opened and 289 allegations closed in March 2006. Of those closed, 34.3% were substantiated (n=99). MH 'Unsubstantiated' cases include those that didn't meet the abuse definition.

## Shelter & Emergency Housing Assistance



\* Data for homeless shelter & housing services have one month lag time. Rental Assistance and Voucher data is currently unavailable.

### Type of Homeless Clients Served: February 2006



\* Not including rental assistance and voucher clients. 135 people received housing assistance services in Feb. 2006. The average age of youth who used shelter or transitional housing was 18.5.

**Notes:** The number of DD clients continued its trend by adding 24 more in caseload over February. The average daily new ADS protective service investigations increased to 9.8 this month from 7.1 in February. The average daily Youth Shelter population and homeless clients served by ADS slightly decreased over January. Mental Health outpatient and part of homeless services data were still not available for the March update.
