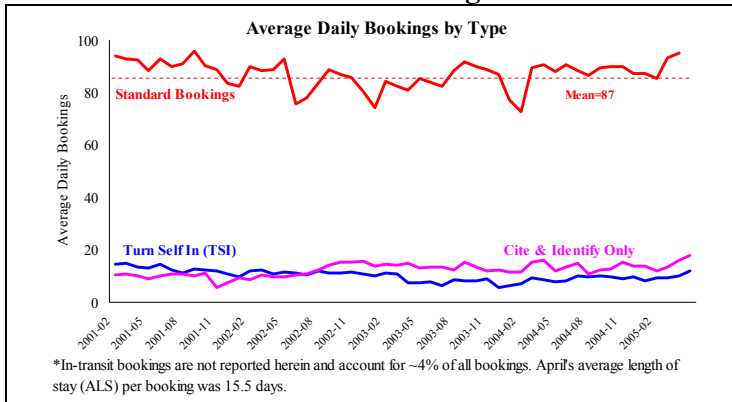
## Multnomah County: Reported Index Offenses



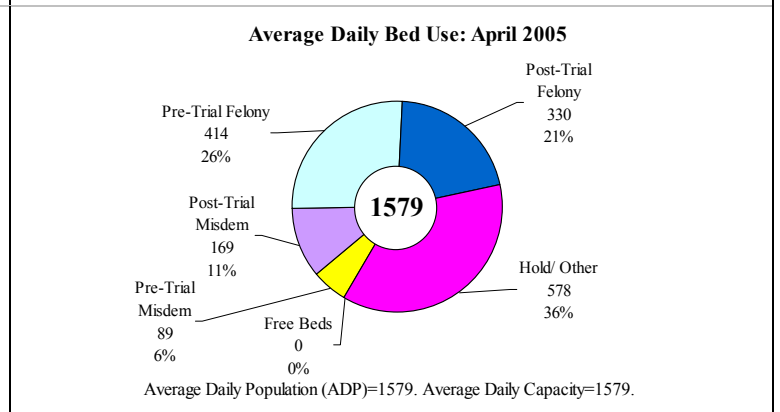
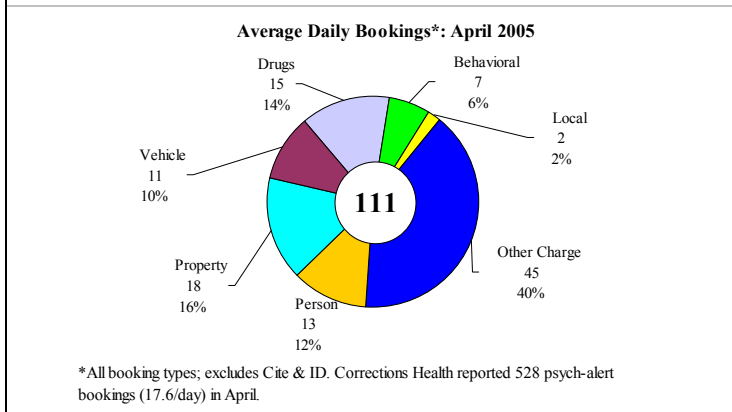
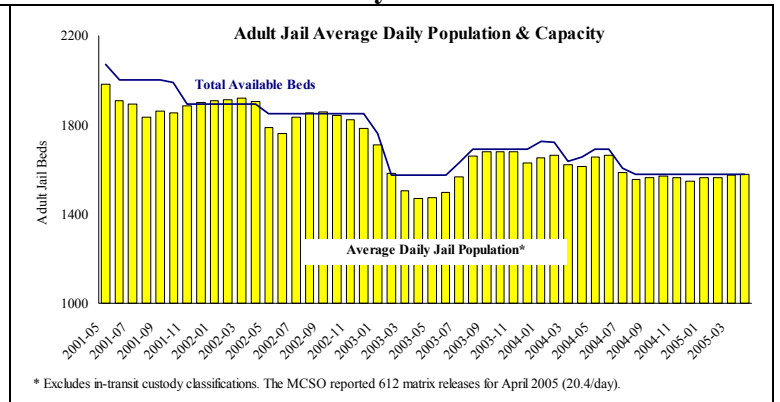
## Multnomah County: Arrests (PPB only)

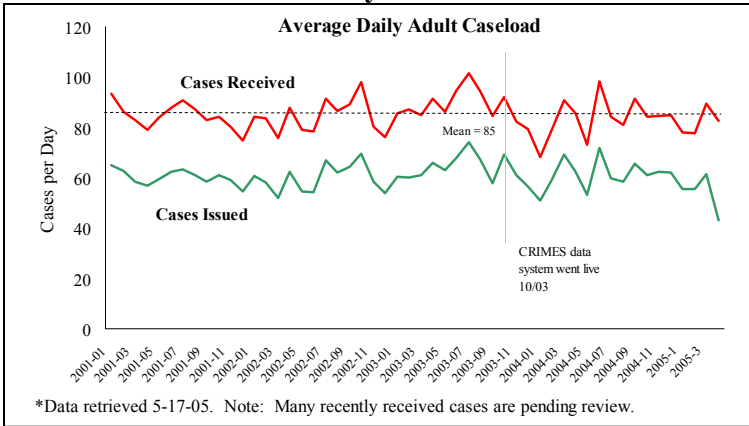
## Sheriff: Custody- Adult Jail Beds



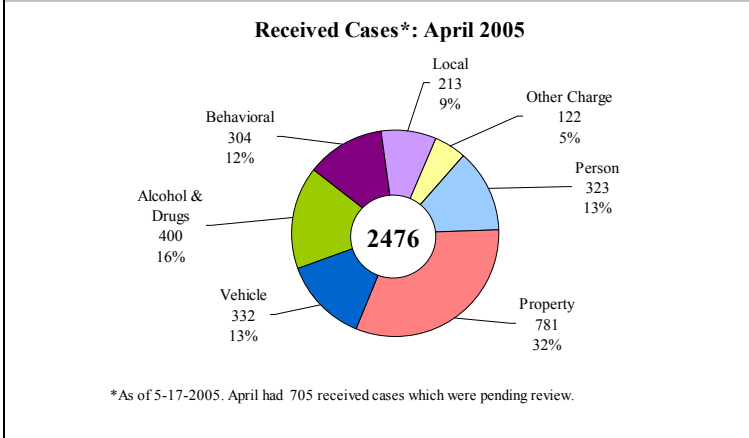
**Notes:** Average Daily Reported Offenses has remained relatively consistent since January; April showed a slight increase in reported *Auto Theft* in both Portland and Gresham. Average Daily Arrests decreased for all categories except *Vehicle/ DUI* and *Other* offenses. Average Daily Bookings to continue to be elevated; April increased, mainly due to standard bookings for *Property* offenses. The MCSO reported 612 matrix releases (average 20.4 per day).

**Notes.** The DA Adult cases received decreased by 285 cases—due to decreases in all offense categories except *Property* (up 4%, to 32% of all received cases). Adult Supervision caseloads increased slightly overall over last month due to increases in *Specialized* and *Non-Specialized cases* (RST declined). Juvenile caseload was up for medium-risk supervision, but down for high and low-risk youth in March, averaging a total of 24 cases per counselor.
