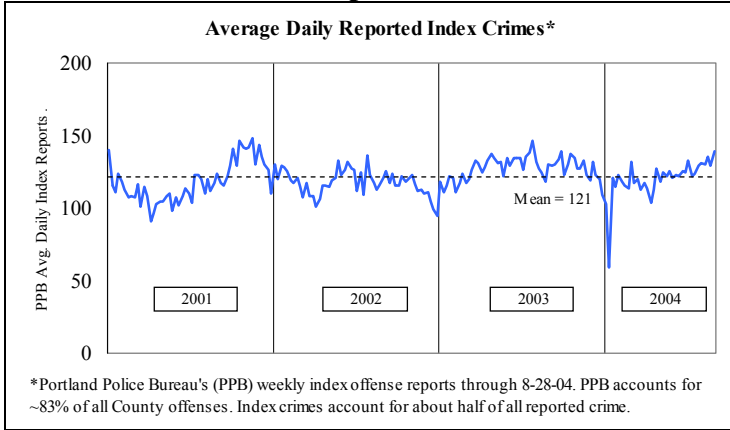
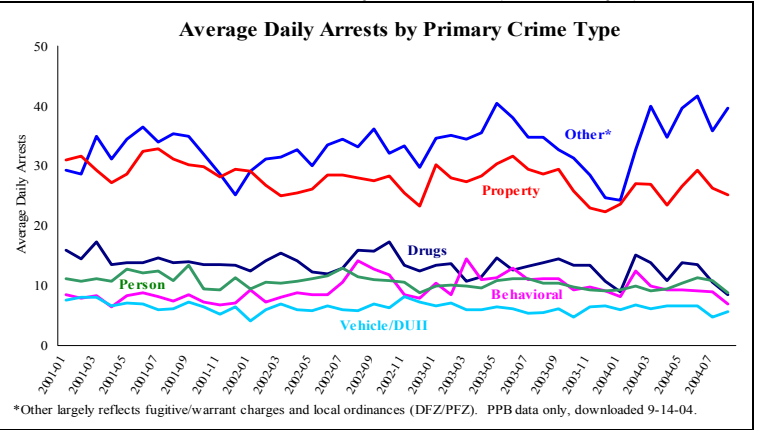

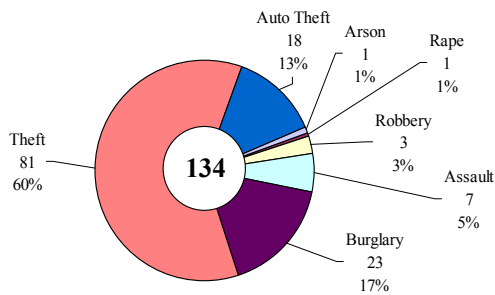
Portland Police: Reported Part I Offenses



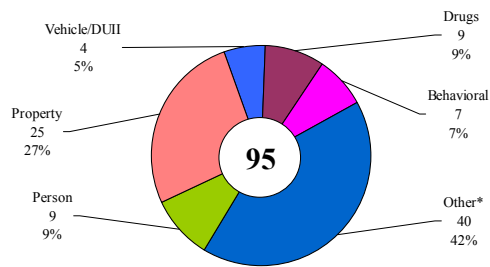
Multnomah County: Arrests (PPB only*)



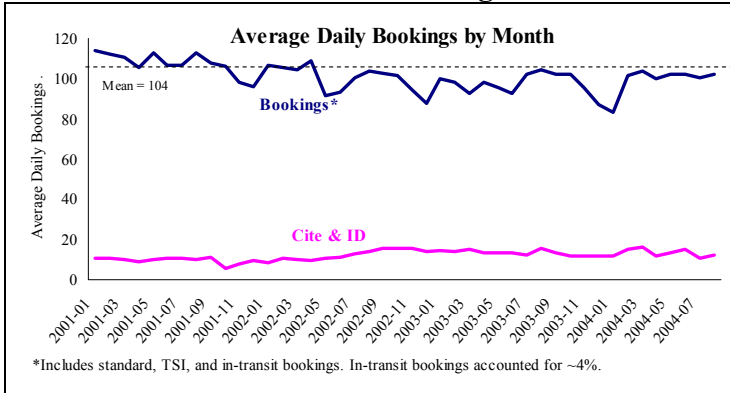
Average Daily Reported Index Offenses*



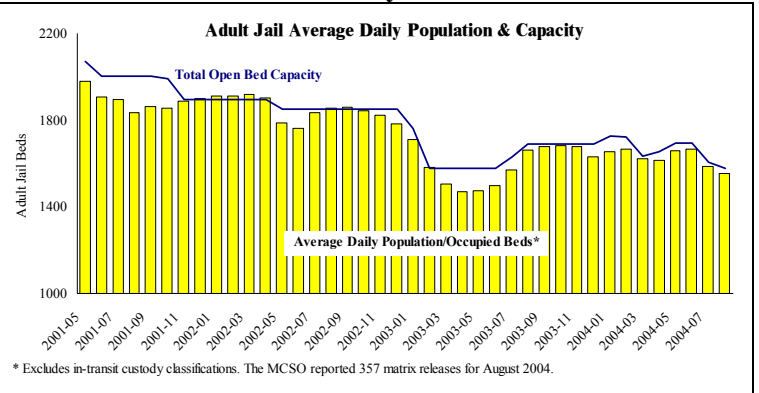
Average Daily Arrests: August 2004



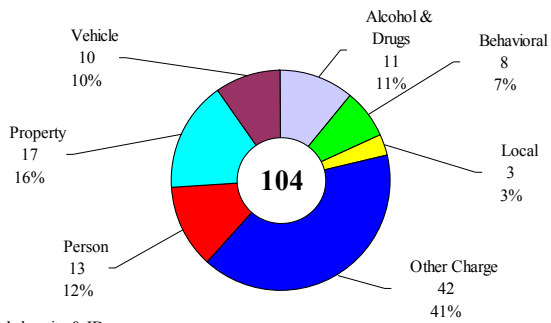
Sheriff: Bookings



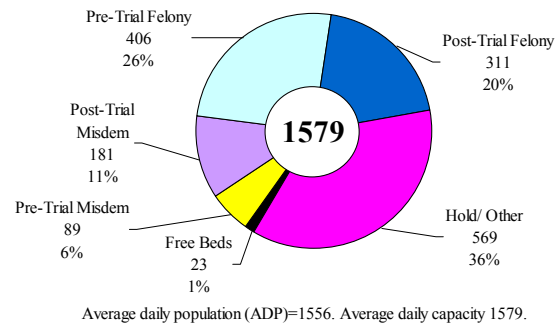
Sheriff: Custody- Adult Jail Beds



Average Daily Bookings*: August 2004



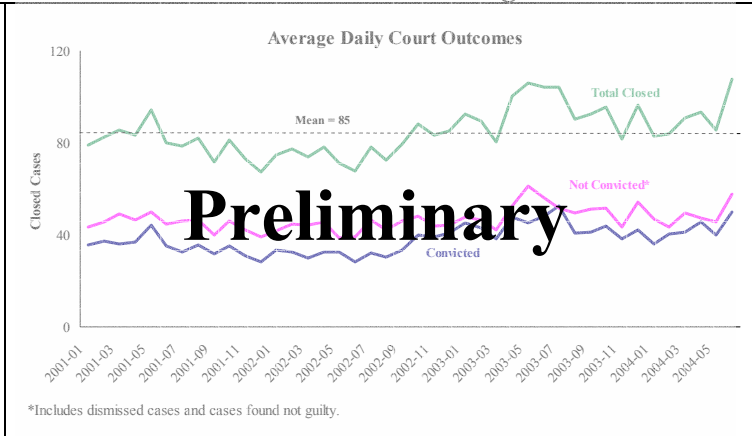
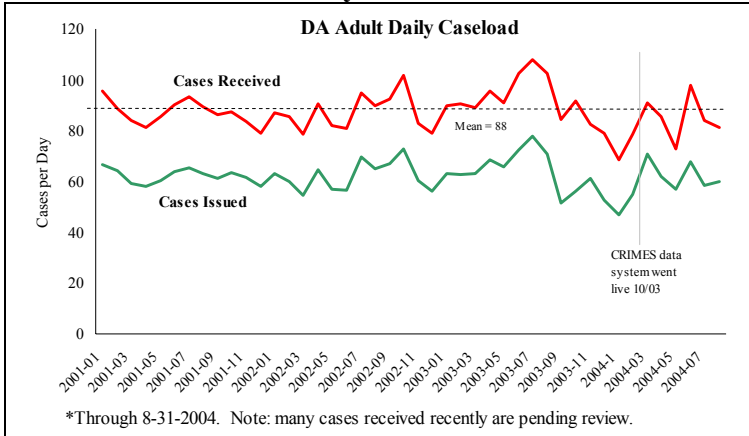
Average Daily Bed Use: August 2004



Notes. Reported Part I Offenses increased due mainly to elevated burglary and theft levels. Although overall crimes are still down ~6% over last year, the daily average reports were the highest since Sept. 2003. The average daily arrests decreased by 2 (June's updated figure is 97). Bookings continued to stay consistent. Matrix releases declined by a total of 100 from July.

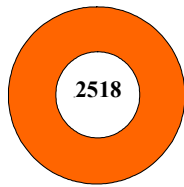
Court Processes: Sentencing Outcomes



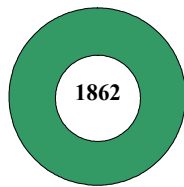

DA Adult Caseload: August 2004



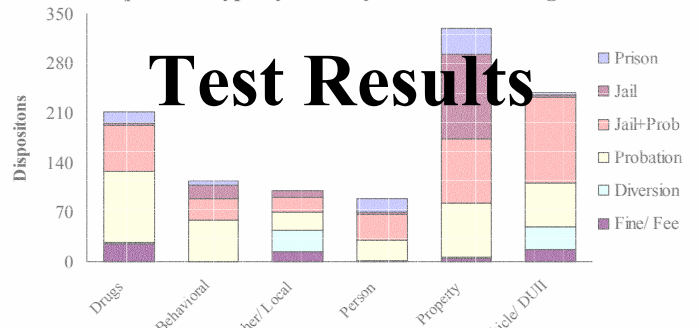
Cases Received

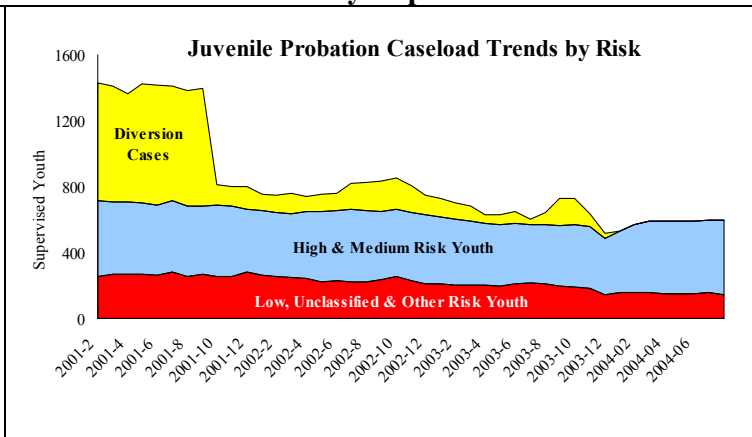
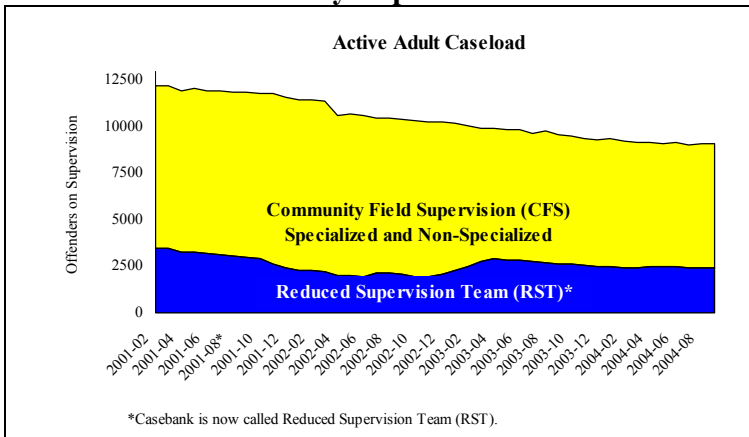
Disposition Type by Primary Conviction*: Aug 2004



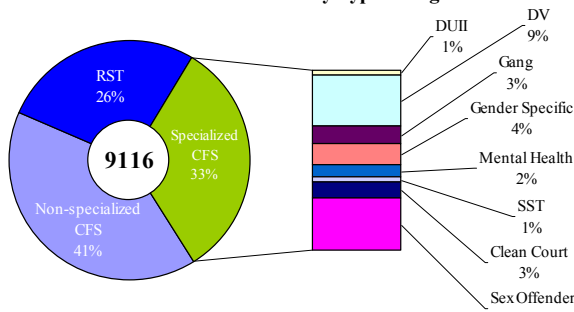
*Primary conviction charge is the most serious charge with a conviction and may differ from the primary charge. Approximately 3/4 of convictions are for misdemeanors.

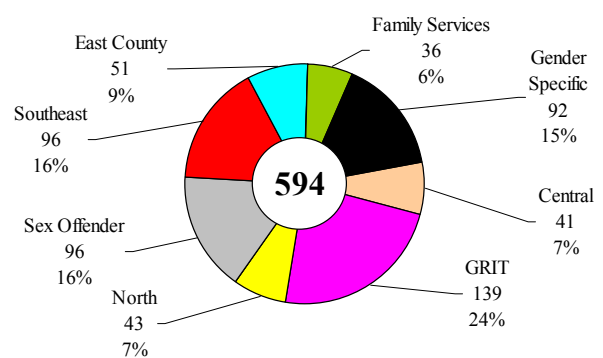
Juvenile Community Supervision: Caseloads

Notes. The DA Adult Caseload saw a decline in the number of cases received by 92, while the number of cases issued increased by 53. The active Adult Supervision Caseload saw a slight increase: RST caseload increased for the first time in 5 months. The juvenile caseload remained relatively constant overall. However, the number of high- and medium-risk caseload increased this month, while the number of low-risk caseload decreased over June.
