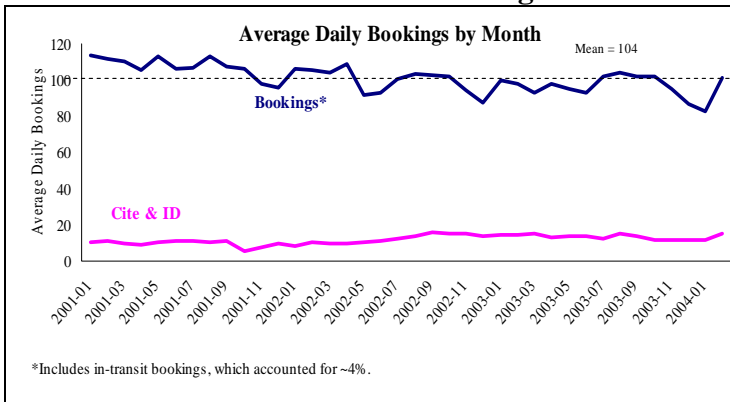
## Portland Police: Reported Offenses



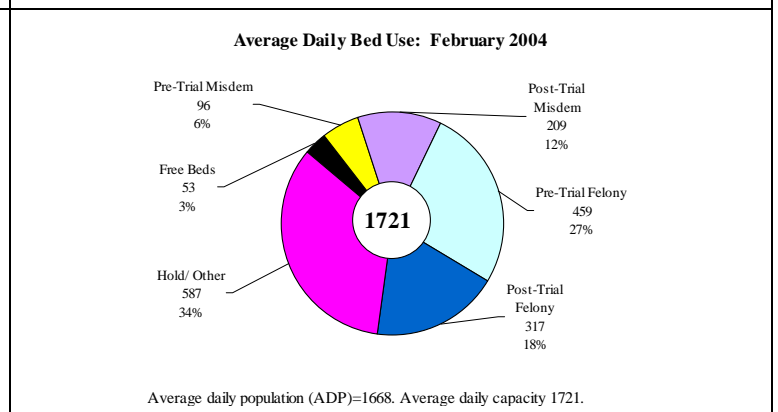
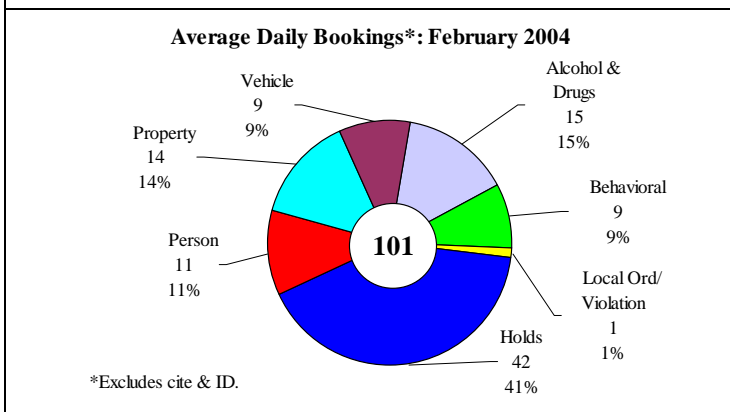
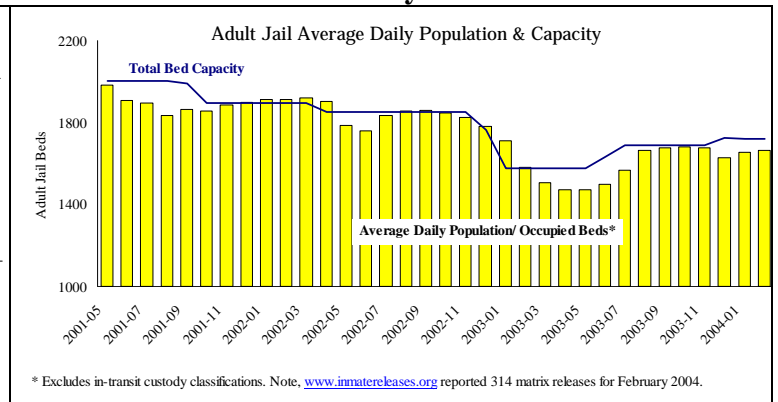
## Multnomah County: Arrests (PPB, MCSO, & Fairview)



## Sheriff: Bookings



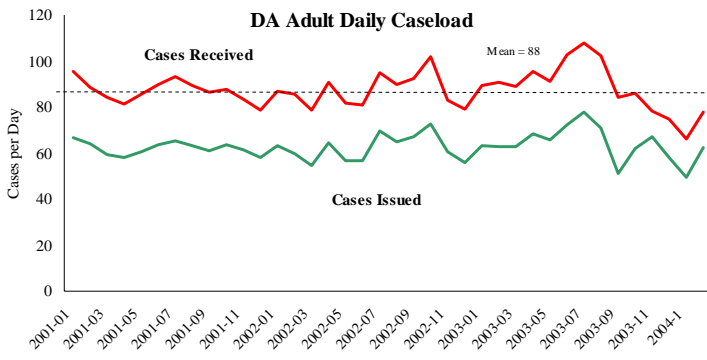
## Sheriff: Custody- Adult Jail Beds



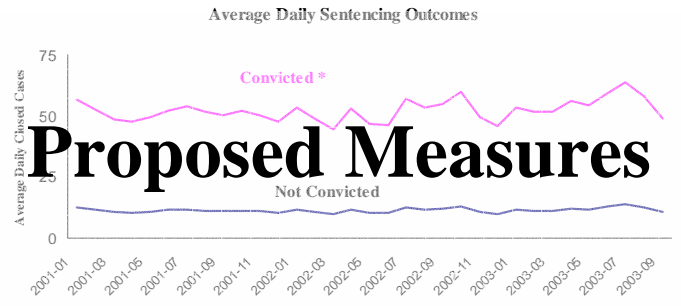
**Notes.** The four-week floating average daily number of reported crimes was consistent with the multi-year average. The average daily bookings increased from 83 to 101, largely due to the doubling of the drug offense bookings since January. The average daily custody population increased from 1654 to 1668; system capacity averaged 1721 beds. Matrix releases increased dramatically over January due to the closure of Inverness beds and the opening of work release beds.

### Court Processes: Sentencing Outcomes



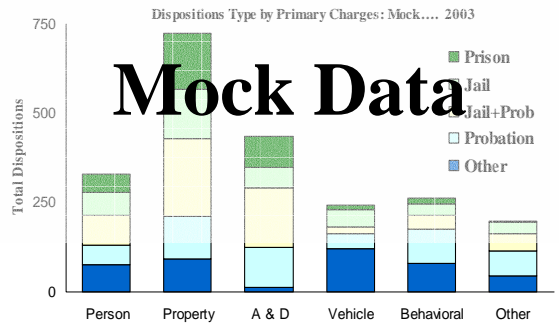

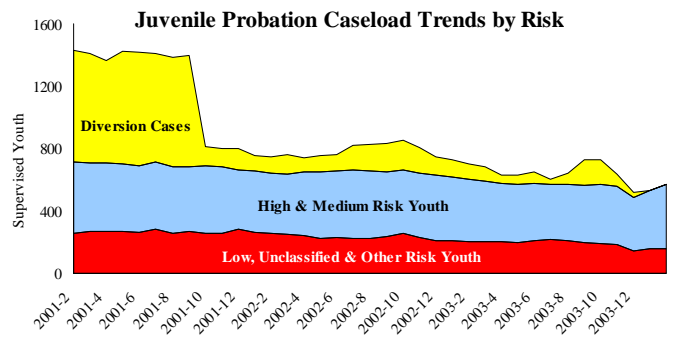

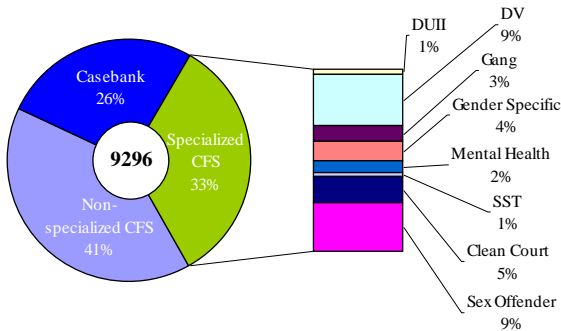

### Juvenile Community Supervision: Caseloads

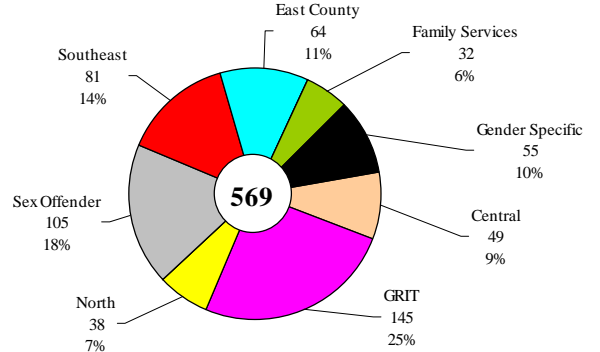


### Adult Active Caseload by Type\*: February 2004

**Notes.** The District Attorney's adult caseload increased for the first time since October 2003; this was likely due in part to their new data system (CRIMES) and its processes operating more efficiently. The number of total active adult supervision cases fell from 9,334 to 9,296, due to fewer non-specialized cases. The juvenile caseloads increased from 532 to 569; this increase may reflect the transition of diversion cases (eliminated due to budget cuts) into active juvenile caseloads.
