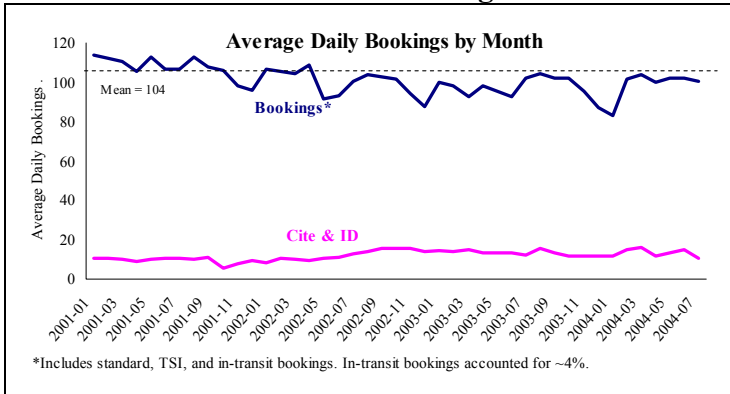
Portland Police: Reported Part I Offenses



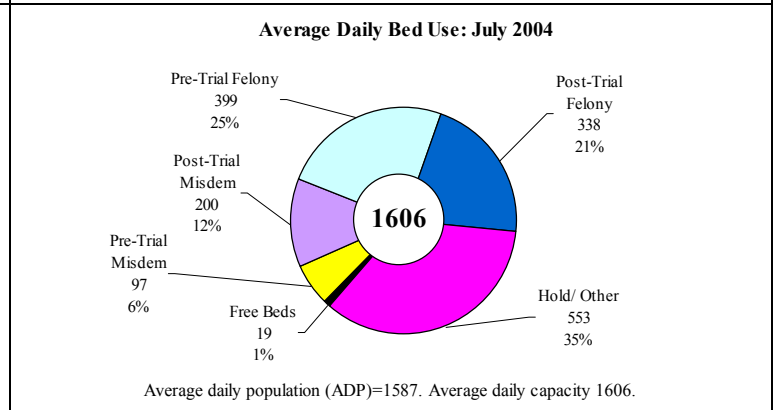
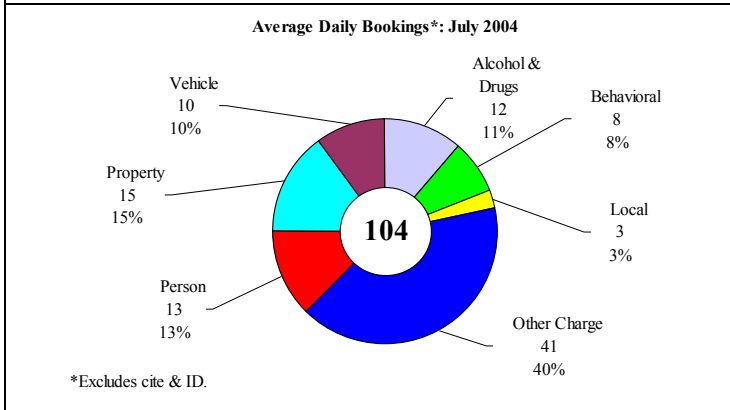
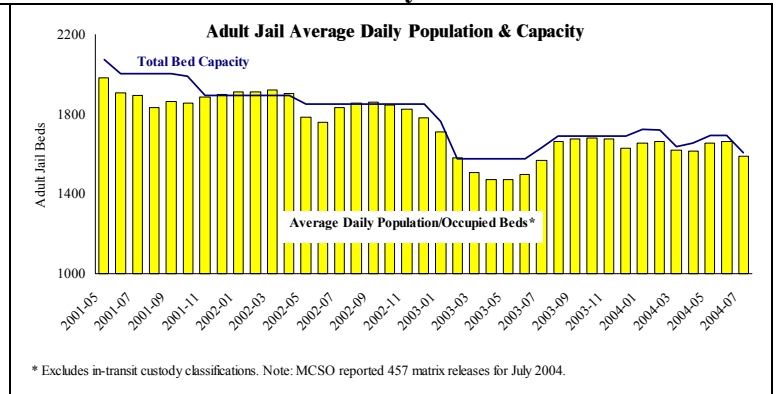
Multnomah County: Arrests (PPB only*)



Sheriff: Bookings



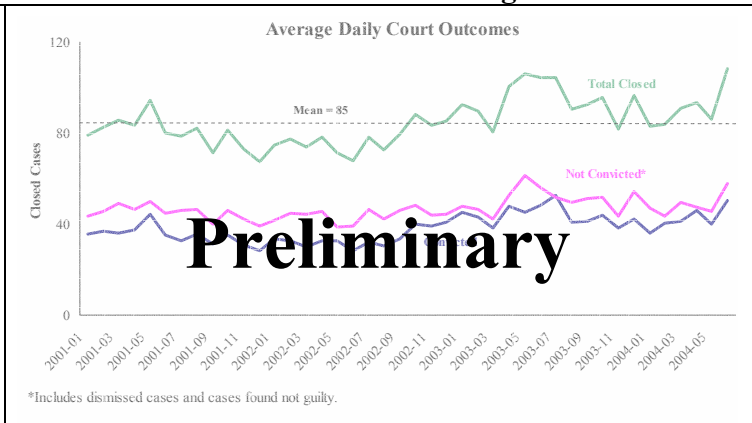
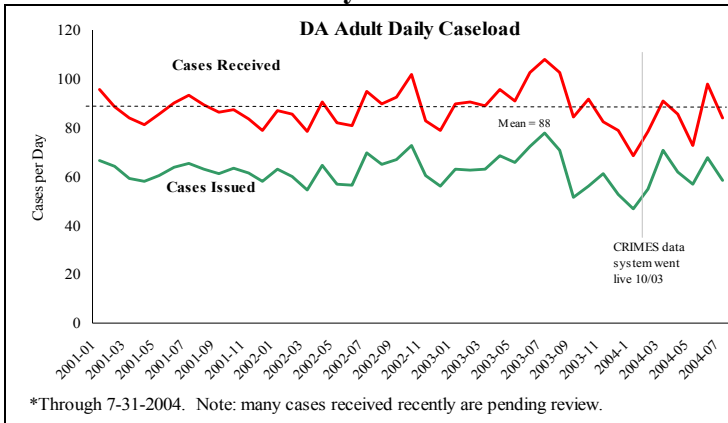
Sheriff: Custody- Adult Jail Beds



Notes. Reported Part I Offenses slightly increased due mainly to elevated burglary levels, however overall crimes are down ~7% over last year at this time. The Average Daily Arrests decreased by 17 (June's updated figure is 111), with declines seen in all categories. Bookings are at the multiyear average and have been relatively consistent since February 2004. The Average Daily Jail population decreased by 78 as the number of beds declined an average of 87. Matrix releases nearly doubled from June to 457.

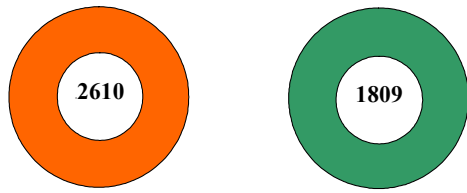
Court Processes: Sentencing Outcomes

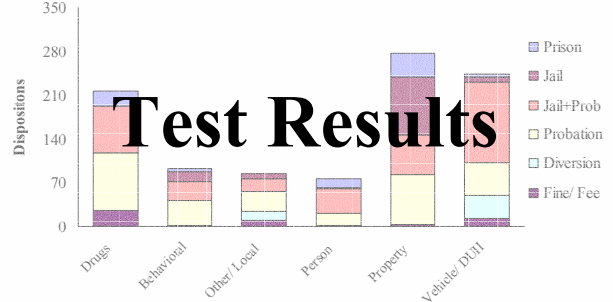

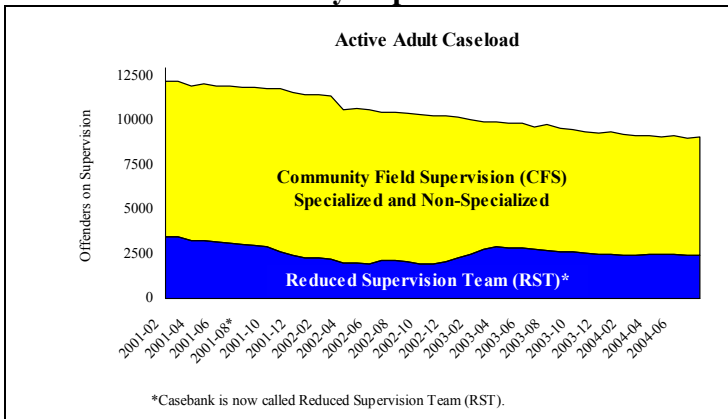
Disposition Type by Primary Conviction*: July 2004



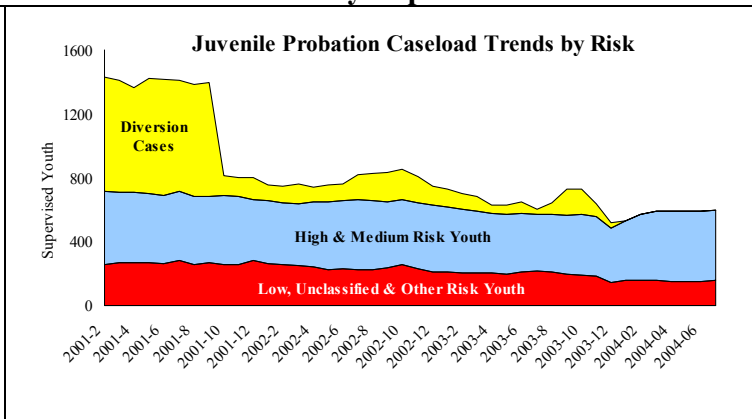
*Primary conviction charge is the most serious charge with a conviction and may differ from the primary charge. Approximately 3/4 of convictions are for misdemeanors.

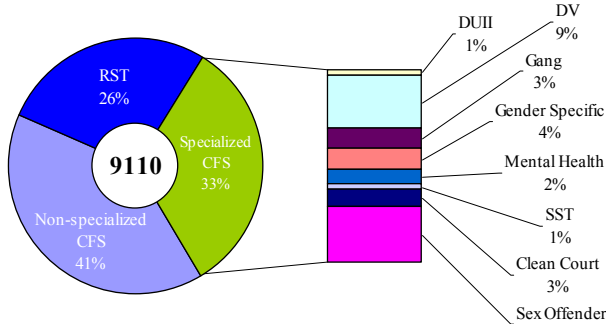
Juvenile Community Supervision: Caseloads



*Casebank is now called Reduced Supervision Team (RST).

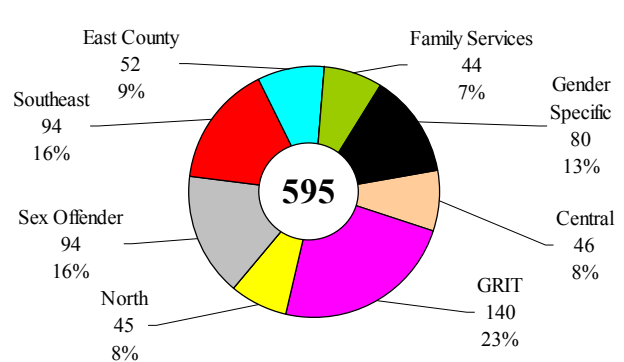


Adult Active Caseload by Type*: July 2004

Notes. The DA Adult Caseload decreased: cases received by 334 and cases issued by 225. The active Adult Supervision Caseload saw a slight increase, while RST caseload continued to decline. The juvenile caseload remained constant overall: The number of high-risk caseload declined slightly, while the number of low-risk caseload increased over May.
