



## Portland Police: Reported Part I Offenses




## Multnomah County: Arrests (PPB only\*)




### Average Daily Reported Index Offenses\*




### Average Daily Arrests: June 2004






## Sheriff: Custody- Adult Jail Beds



### Average Daily Bookings\*: June 2004




### Average Daily Bed Use: June 2004




**Notes.** Reported offenses and arrests remained relatively flat compared to May. Bookings are at the multiyear average and were relatively consistent with May. The Average Daily Jail population increased slightly with post-trial felons which coincided with increased use of the MWRC work release center (90% capacity). Available MWRC beds accounted for 21% of unused beds in the system. Additionally, matrix releases declined over May by 66.

### District Attorney: Adult Caseload





### Court Processes: Sentencing Outcomes



### DA Adult Caseload: June 2004




Cases Received



Cases Issued



### Disposition Type by Primary Conviction\*: June 2004





### Adult Community Supervision: Caseloads



### Juvenile Community Supervision: Caseloads




### Adult Active Caseload by Type\*: June 2004

**Notes.** The DA Adult Caseload increased substantially: cases received increased by 682 and the number of cases issued by 274. These increases were reflected in the test Court Processes data. Outcomes suggest increased vehicle/DUII and Other/local offense cases and increased fine/ fees over May. The active Adult Supervision Caseload continued to decline. The juvenile caseload remained constant overall, however, the number of high-risk caseload had a slight increase over May 2004.
