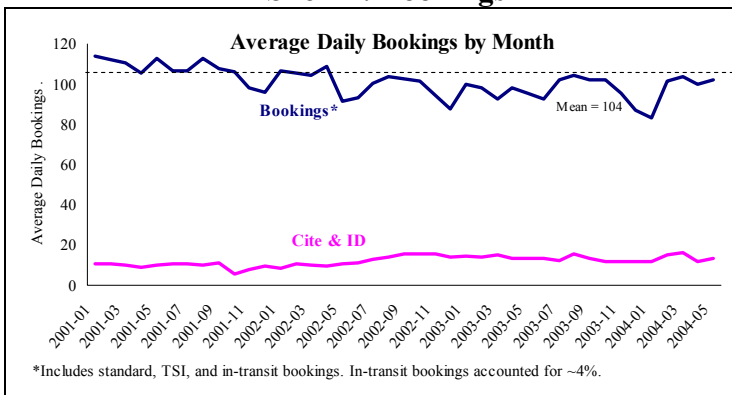
Portland Police: Reported Part I Offenses



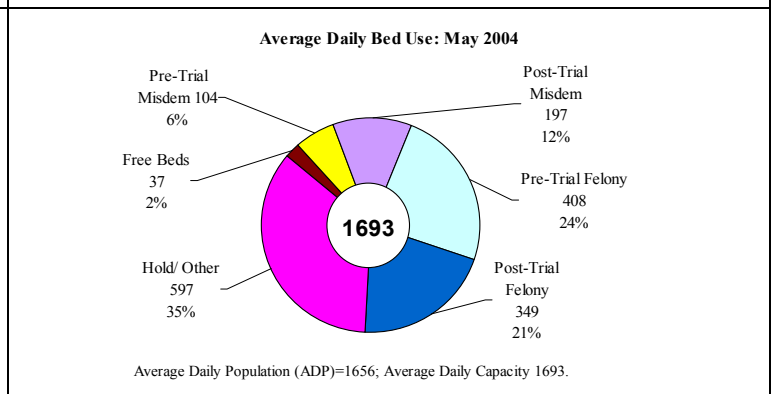
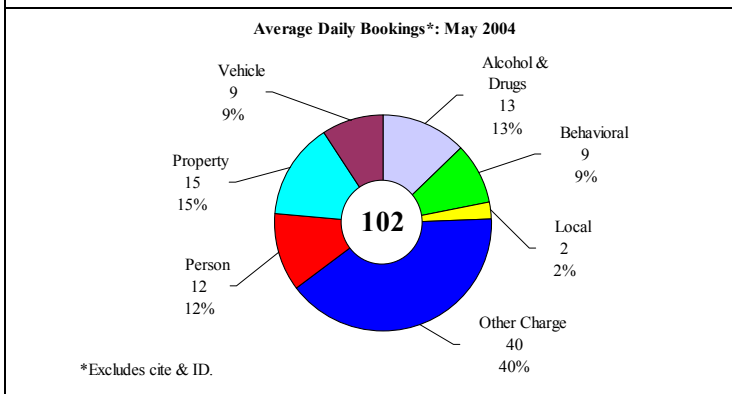
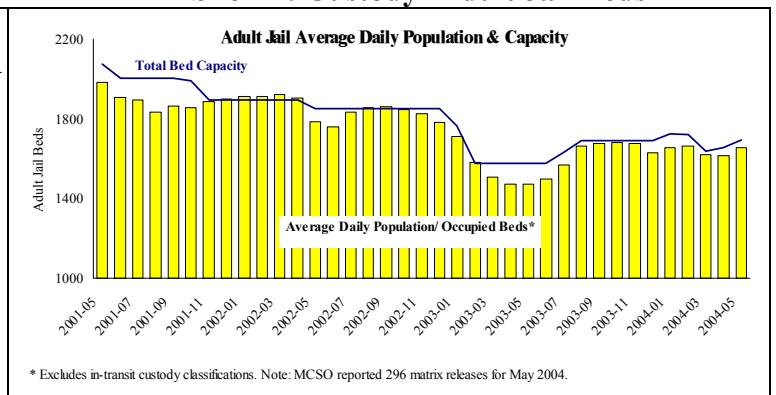
Multnomah County: Arrests (PPB only*)

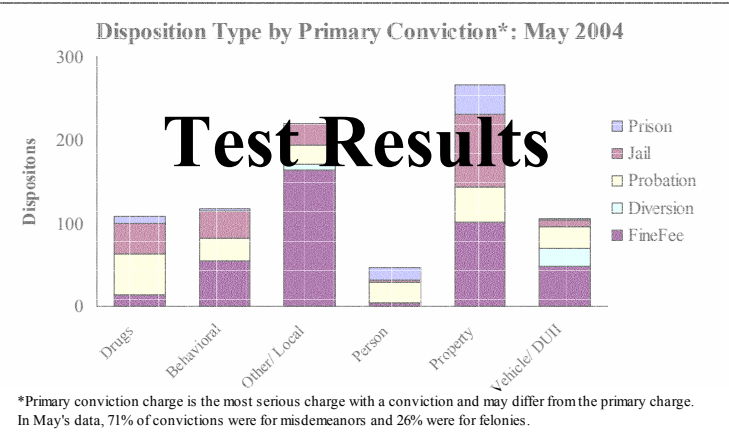
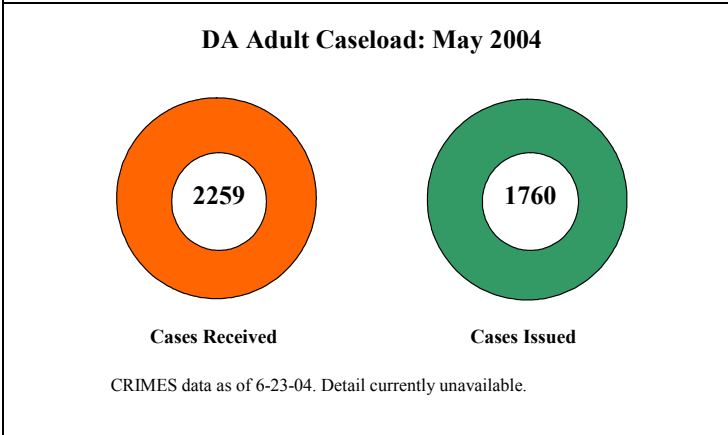
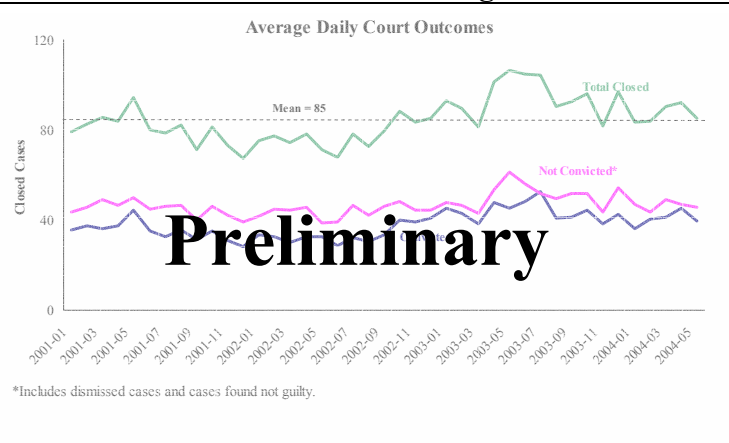
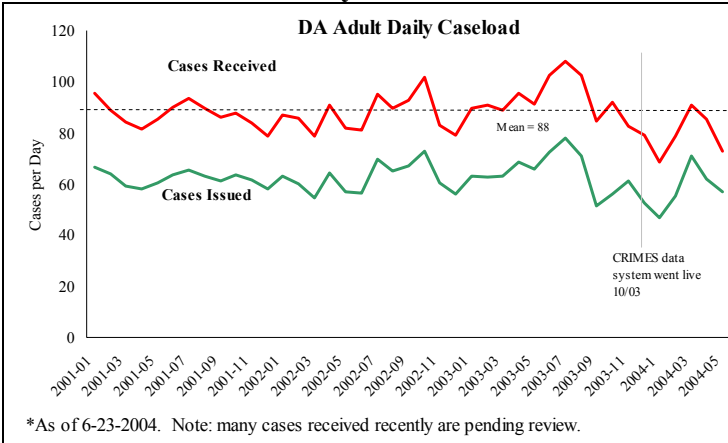
Sheriff: Custody- Adult Jail Beds



Notes. PPB (as of week 23) reports Part I Offenses down 7% from the same time last year from reduced levels of the theft. Bookings remained relatively consistent with April. The average daily jail capacity increased from April to 1693 (current system capacity). The MWRC work release center continues to be about 1/4 empty, accounting for 37% of all free beds. Matrix releases increased to 296 matrix releases.

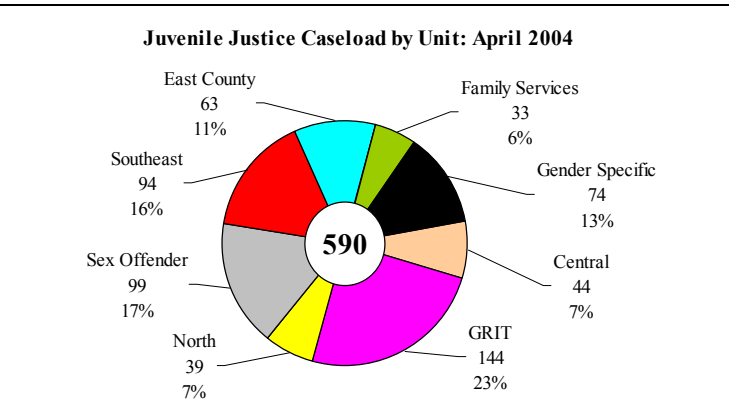
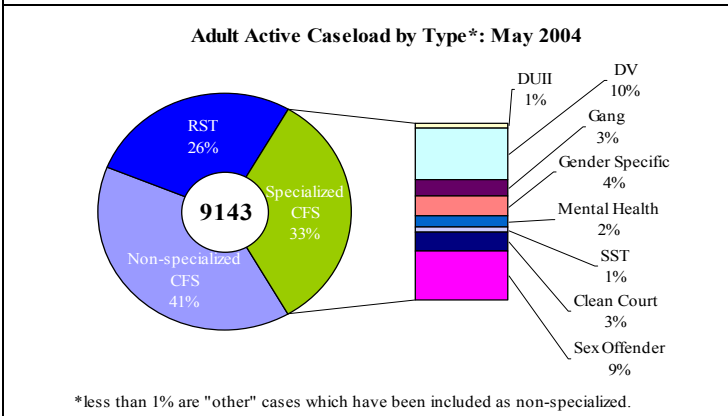
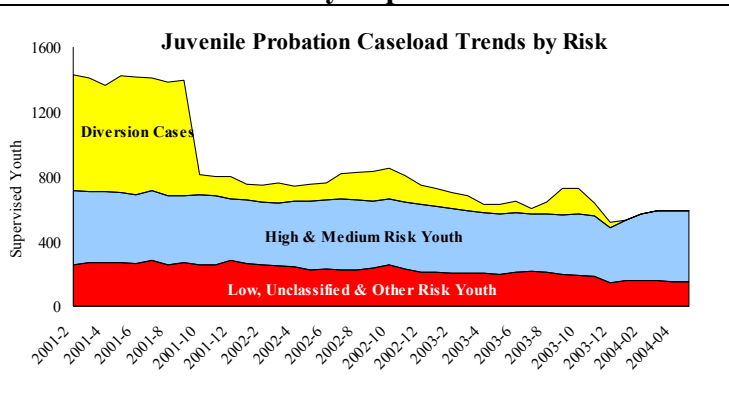
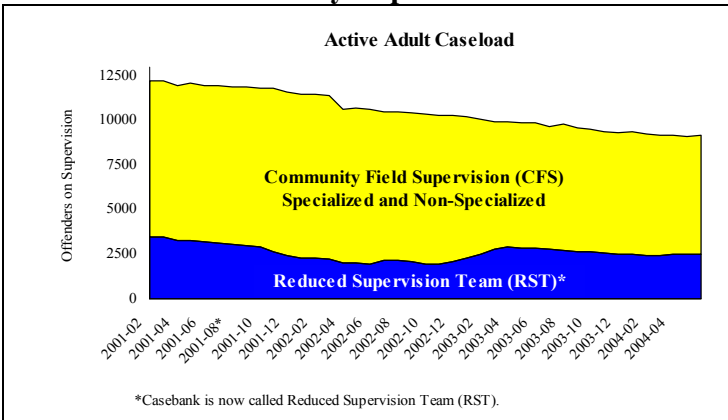
District Attorney: Adult Caseload

Notes. The DA Adult Caseload data was updated for 10/03 - 5/04 to reflect the number of cases with only the initial issued dates; the pattern continues to be erratic. Preliminary court processing data has been developed by the DSSJ team; test results presented have not been 100% verified. The adult supervision caseloads declined slightly over April. "Casebank" services have been reengineered and are now referred to as "Reduced Supervision Team." The juvenile caseload remained constant overall.
