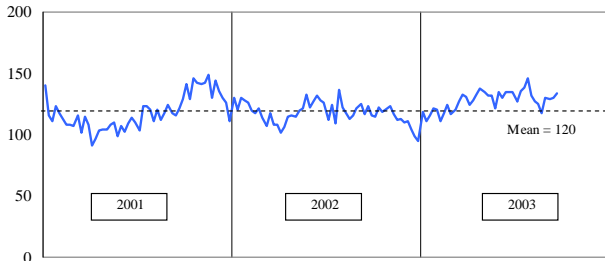

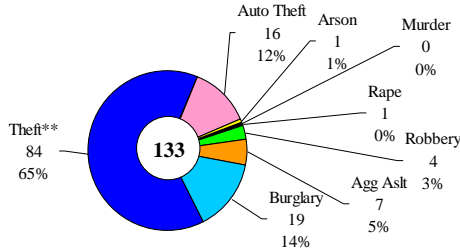
Portland Police: Reported Offenses

*PPB weekly index offense reports through 9-20-03. Index crimes account for half of all reported crime.

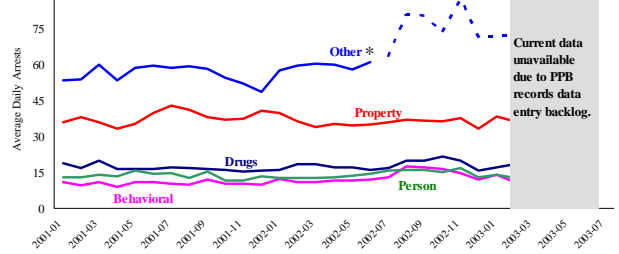
Average Daily Reported Index Offenses*



*City of Portland, 4-week moving average for week ending 9/20/2003

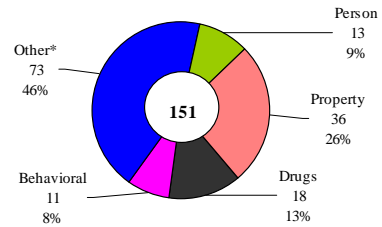
Multnomah County: Arrests (PPB, MCSO, & Fairview)

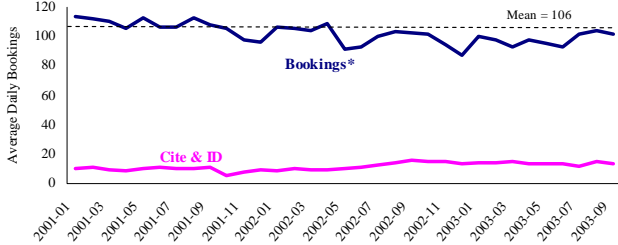
Average Daily Arrests: February 2003

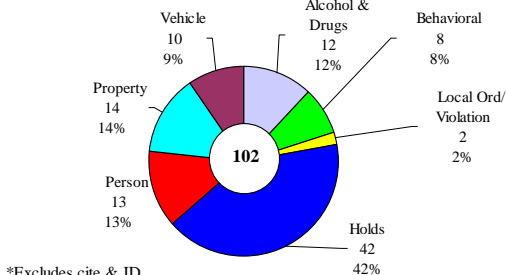
Sheriff: Bookings

*Includes in-transit bookings, which accounted for ~4%.

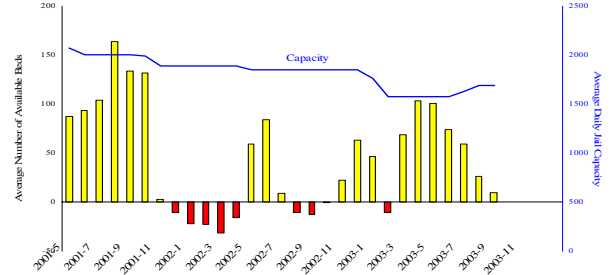
Average Daily Bookings*: September 2003



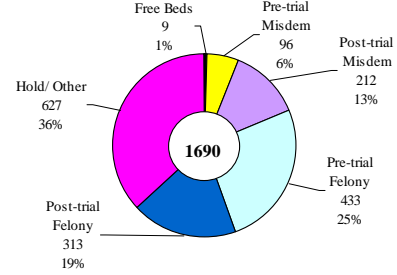

Average Daily Bed Use: September 2003



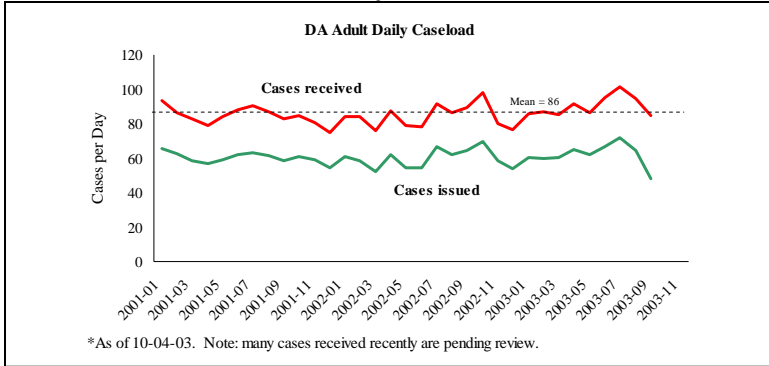
Average daily population (ADP)=1681. Average daily capacity 1690.

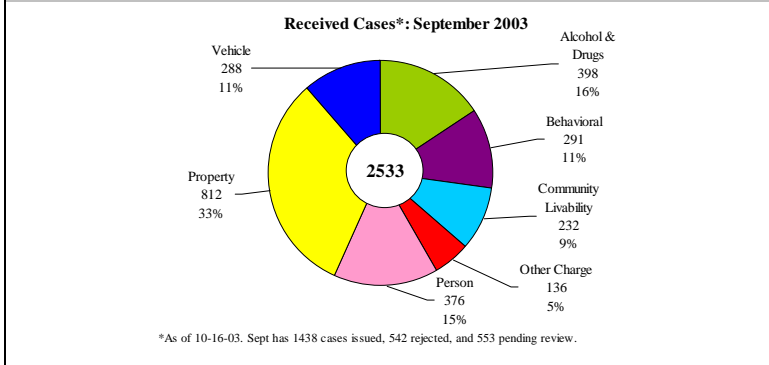
The recent increase in reported theft is driven by an 11.5% increase in reported theft from autos. There was an increase in the average daily inmate population; jail populations averaged 99% of jail capacity.

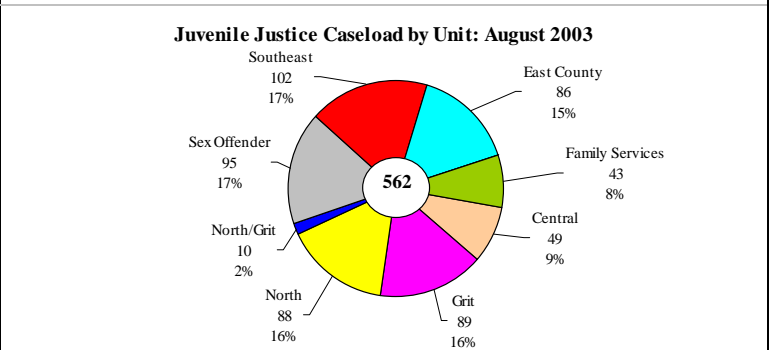
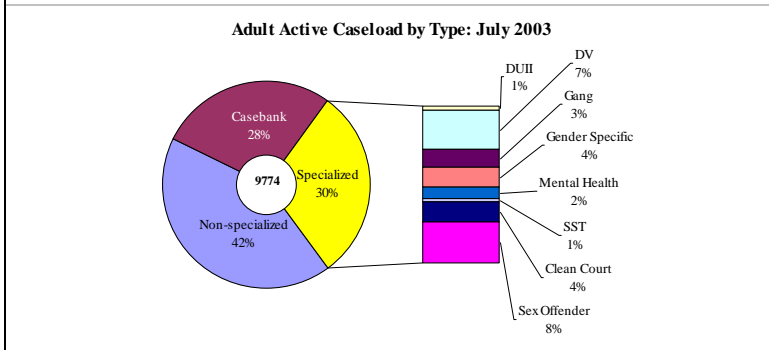
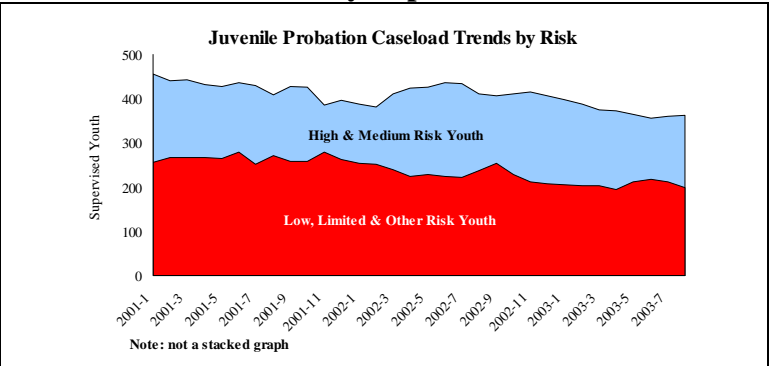
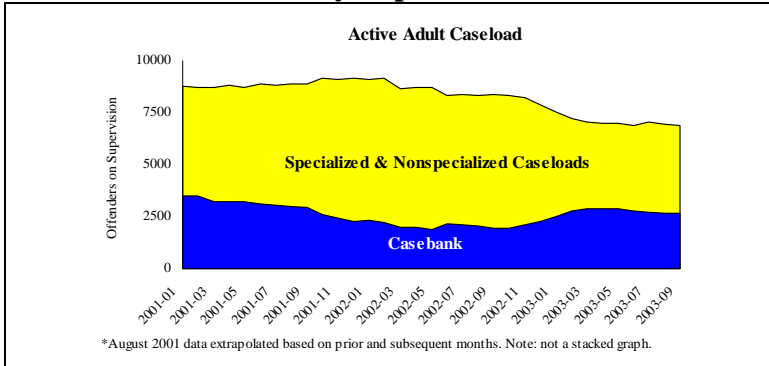

Notes:

Cases received by the DA decreased by ~14%. The largest decreases in the types of charges for cases received were community livability (decreased 31%), vehicle (decreased 29%), and behavioral charges (decreased 27%). Adult and juvenile supervision levels have remained relatively steady since July; high risk youth cases increased slightly. There was a drop in the number of juvenile cases supervised by Central (number of counselors also changed from 3 to 2).
