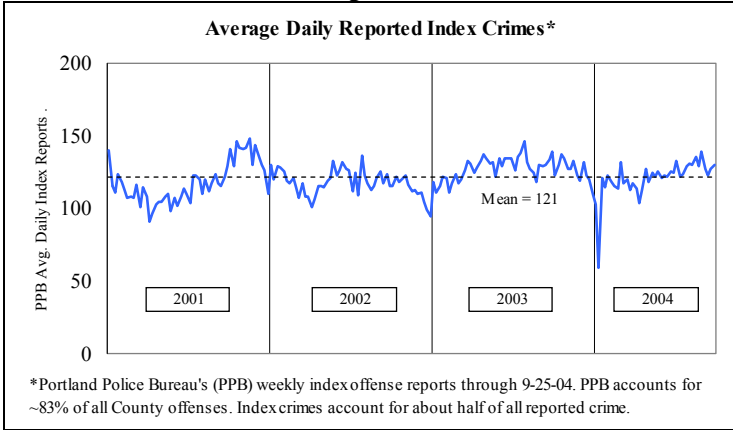
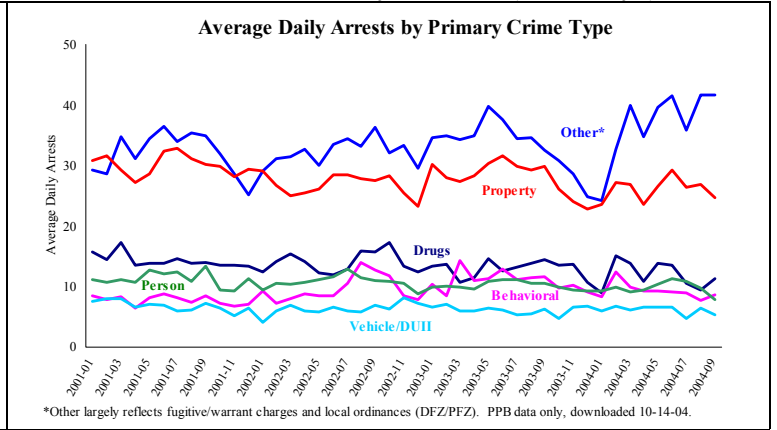

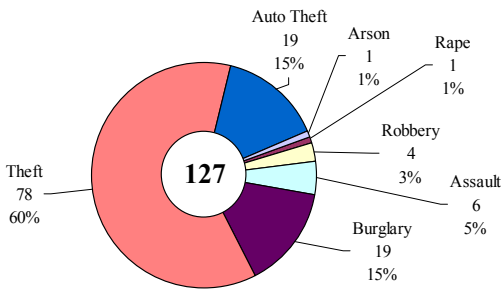
Portland Police: Reported Part I Offenses



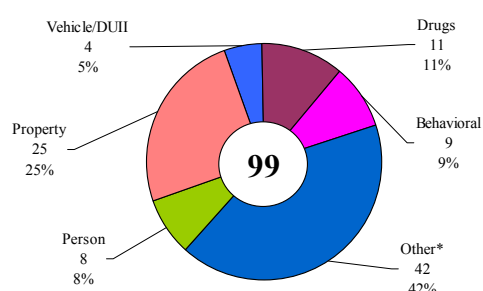
Multnomah County: Arrests (PPB only*)



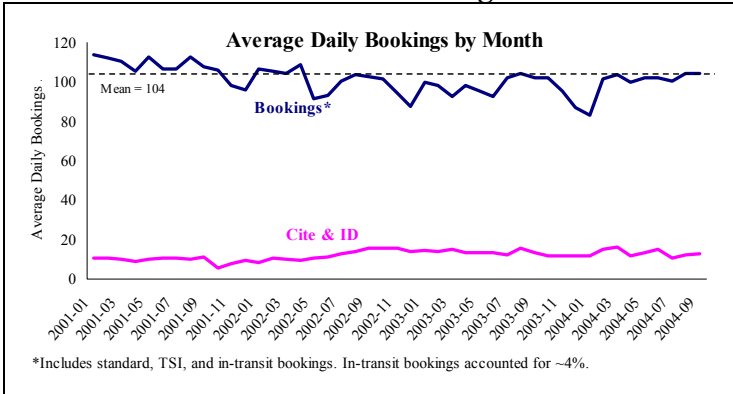
Average Daily Reported Index Offenses*



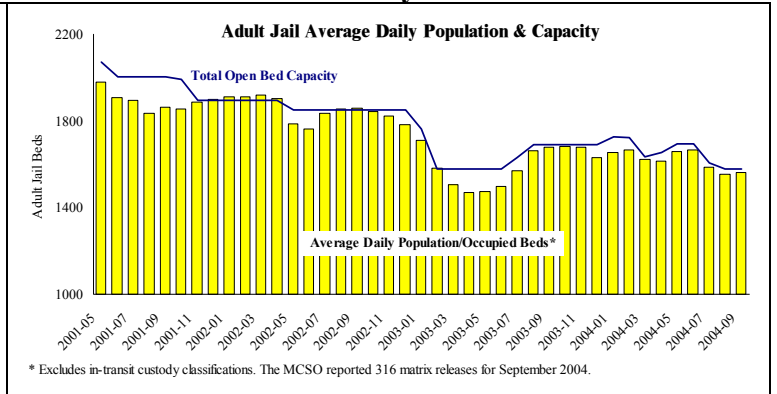
Average Daily Arrests: September 2004



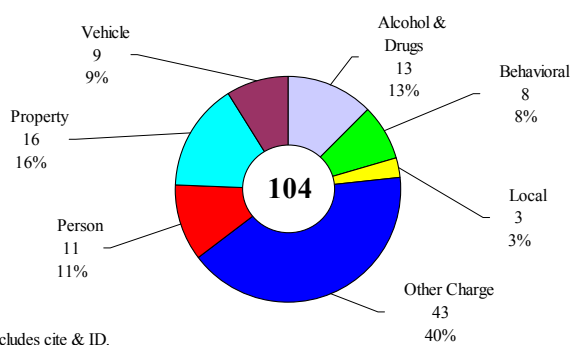
Sheriff: Bookings



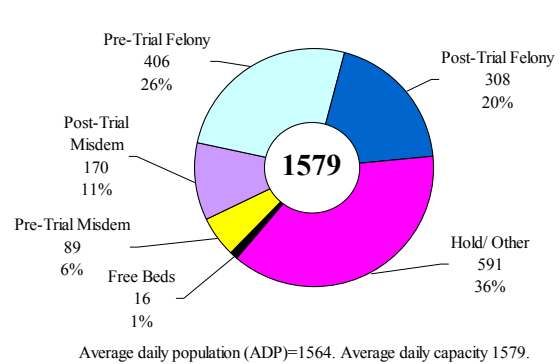
Sheriff: Custody- Adult Jail Beds



Average Daily Bookings*: September 2004



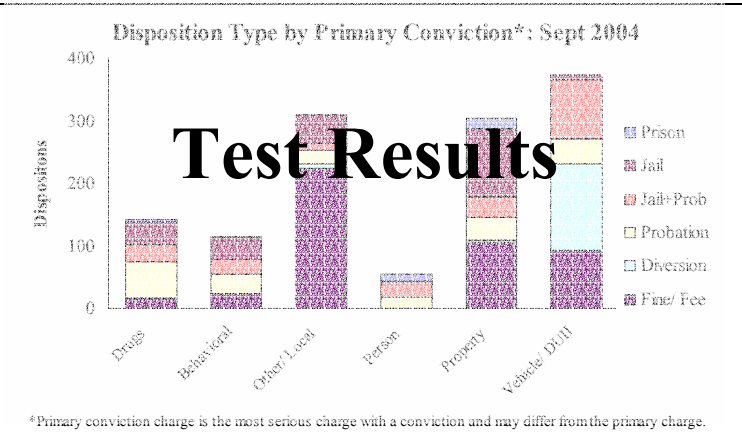
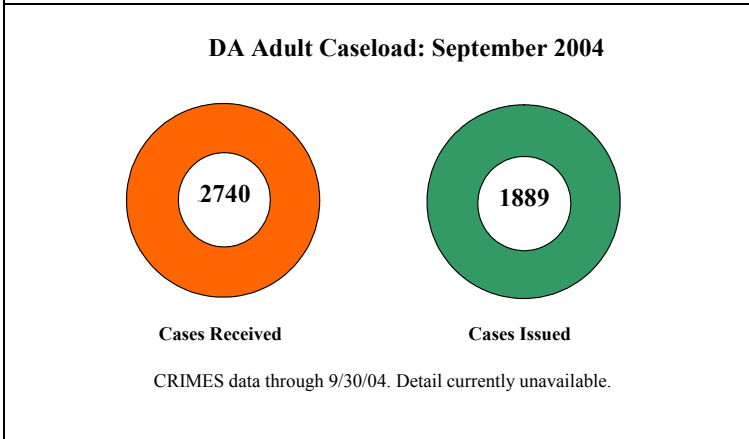
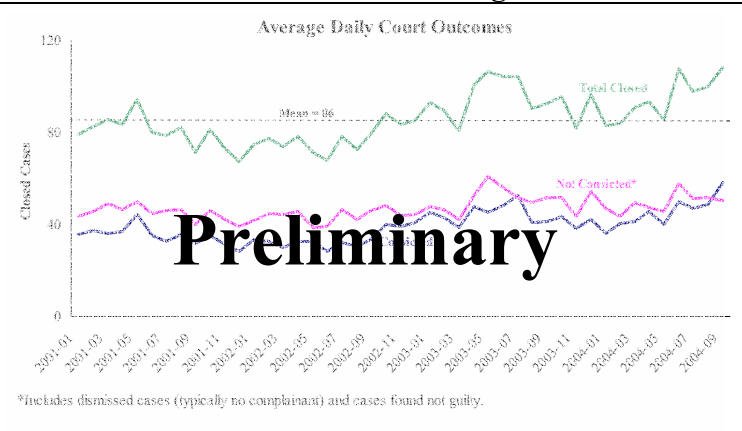
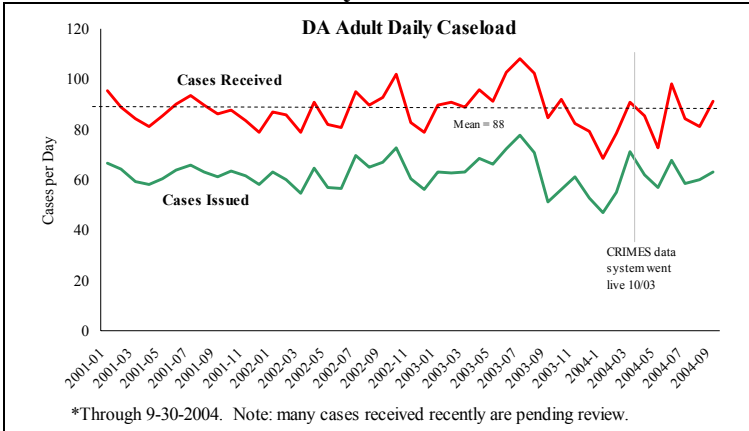
Average Daily Bed Use: September 2004



Notes. The average daily reported index offenses (PDX) declined slightly and overall remains 5% lower than last year due to reductions in nearly all index offenses citywide (PPB report week 40). Reports of residential burglary are still elevated especially in the East and Southeast precincts. Booking rates were average. Matrix releases were down from August.

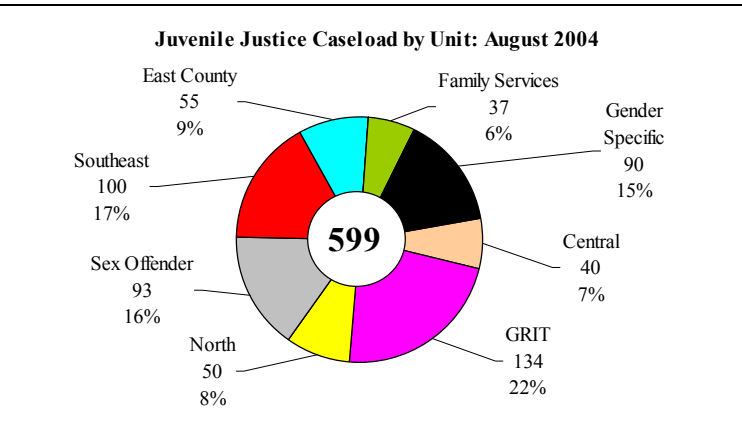
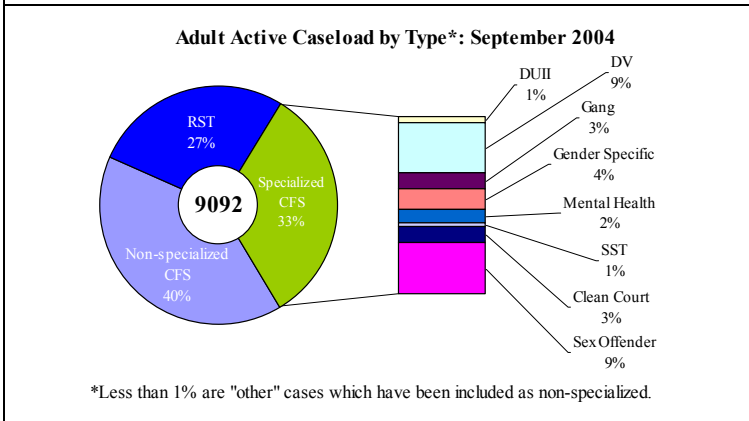
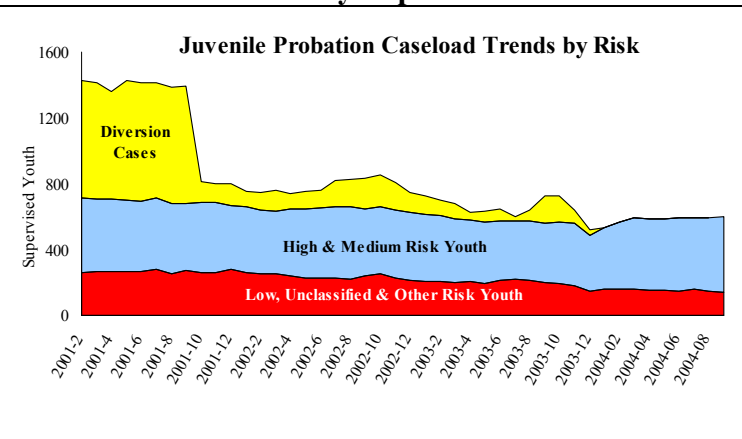
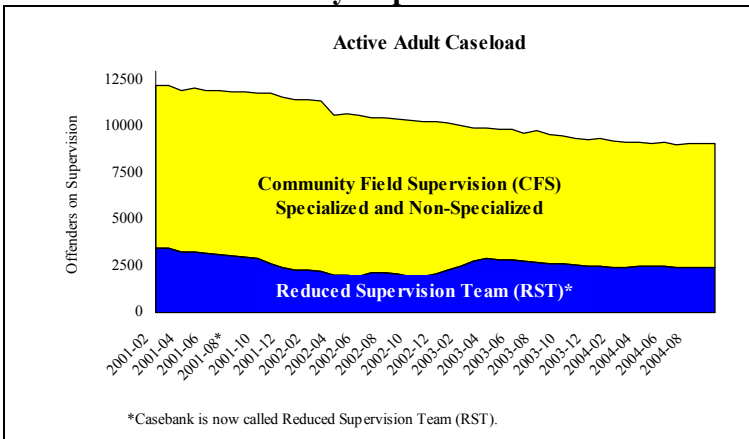

Notes. The DA adult caseload was consistent with the multiyear average. The active adult supervision caseload declined slightly and appears to have flattened out. The juvenile caseload saw a slight increase due to increases in the number of high and medium-risk cases. The number of medium-risk cases (205) was the highest since December 2002.
